

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出版前言

21世纪, 我国经济和社会发展进入新的阶段, 对人才的需求亦不断提高, 高等教育面临新的形势和任务; 英语教育加强培养大学生的英语综合应用能力, 特别是听说能力, 已是当务之急。

2004年6月, 教育部颁布了《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》, 对学生英语能力、课程设置、教学模式和教学评估等提出了明确要求, 这意味着教学手段、教材编写和出版方面的一系列变革。作为全心致力于我国外语教育事业发展的出版者, 我社经过广泛比较和调研, 决定引进英国著名教育出版机构——麦克米伦出版公司的全球畅销教材 Inside Out(《新要求大学英语》), 结合国内教学实际加以改编、奉献给全国师生, 希望它能成为高校贯彻课程要求的得力工具。

本教材具有下列特点:

- 1. 设计编写以学生为中心: 完全采用注重学生知识和情感"参与"的教学策略,回答问题、讨论等开放式题型取代了机械的练习,鼓励学生结合日常生活信息来学习和运用新知识,充分体现了学生在教学过程中的主体地位。
- 2. 选材全面,来源真实,语言地道: 教材各单元按主题划分,每个单元内又包含若干子主题,使所有学生均"有话可说"。课文选自国外的报刊、小说、网站、个人交往材料等;音像材料选自访谈、戏剧、流行歌曲等,让学生接触到真实生活中的地道英语。真实的语境、合适的话题、丰富的内容、新颖的课堂活动,能够唤起学生学习英语的兴趣,使学生通过吸收丰富的语料,快速提高听、说、读、写能力,深入了解英语国家的文化和社会知识,有效培养他们的英语交际能力。
- 4. 立体化的教学资源:《新要求大学英语》共5级(含预备级,适合大学不同起点的学生使用),是一套立体化教材,课本、录音磁带和CD、多媒体光盘和网站紧密结合,互相支持。

课本以综合教程学生用书为核心,配有教师手册、练习册、课堂活动、视听说学生手册和视听说教师手册。

教材支持网站是 www.insideout.net, 为教师提供了丰富的教学资源, 也提供了一个与世界各地的教师交流的平台; 网站还包含E-lesson, 每周更新, 并附有教学指南, 供教师免费下载, 用于课堂教学。

《新要求大学英语》是一套经过教学实践检验、旨在培养学生英语综合应用能力、特别是听说能力的英语教程。在当前英语教学环境和条件发生重大变化,各高校积极探索运用电脑和网络进行教学的情况下,本教材的立体化特征使之适于各校根据实际条件选择使用,尝试多种教学模式和教学手段。我们深信,本套教材是贯彻《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》、提高教学质量、培养高层次人才的最佳选择之一。

Reading

The Brand New **Heavies**

Growing up in the London suburb of Ealing, old school friends Jan Kincaid, Andrew Levy and Simon Bartholomew pursued their love of soul music and 70s funk in the London clubs of the mid-eighties. They listened and danced to the music of James Brown, The Crusaders, Rufus and many others, and decided they had no option but to try it for themselves. They rehearsed regularly at Kincaid's home and, under the name of Brothers International, recorded their music on tape. When local DJs started playing their music after a James Brown track, they were ecstatic.

In 1987, when they renamed themselves The Brand New Heavies, they added a brass section, and their debut album was released on the indie label, Acid Jazz. This recording captured the attention of Michael Ross, founder of the Los Angeles-based label Delicious Vinyl, and in 1990, Ross signed the Heavies to his label and paired them with Atlanta-born vocalist N'Dea Davenport. He sent them back into the studio to re-record several songs and add some new ones. When the band made their US debut, Never Stop became a Top 5 R & B single, and they haven't stopped since. Meanwhile, back in the UK, songs like Dream Come True and Stay This Way invaded the airwaves, transforming the band from a club wonder into a world-wide success.

In 1992, the band started working with hip hop artists like Masta Ace and Kool G. Rap, and their second release broke all the rules by mixing rap with their own style of funk. The next album, Brother Sister produced a string of hits and went double platinum in the UK and near gold in the US. At this point N'Dea Davenport left the group to go solo, and the vocalist/songwriter, Siedah Garrett, who had worked with Quincy Jones, Michael Jackson and Madonna, joined up. Together, they recorded Shelter, their most successful disc to date. The title track is a hard piece of funk with a disco feel, there is also an instrumental and beautiful ballads like Feels Like

No longer just an acid jazz band, we can expect more changes in the future. Says Andrew Levy, 'The Brand New Heavies are still kicking, no doubt about it. We're moving on and we're moving on strong.'
