Forward: For a Peaceful World

As a permanent member of the United Nations Security Council, China consistently emphasizes and supports UN peacekeeping operations, actively assumes the responsibilities of a large nation and performs international obligations.

Upon the request of UN, Chinese government sent its first batch of peacekeeping police to Timor–Leste to undertake peacekeeping missions in January 2000, marking the debut of Chinese police in UN peacekeeping operations. The First Chinese Formed Police Unit composed of 125 members arrived in PORT–AU–PRINCE, Capital of Haiti in October 2004, turning a new page of Chinese police's participation in UN peacekeeping operations, for the first time of which a complete set of police force has sent out for misson. Since then, Chinese peacekeeping police, one batch after another, went abroad to undertake the holy mission of safeguarding world peace.

During the past decade, China has sent altogether 1,665 person-times peacekeeping police to seven mission areas including Timor-Leste and Afghanistan in Asia, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Kosovo in Europe, Liberia and Sudan in Africa and Haiti in America. Chinese peacekeeping police loyally implements its spirit of "Being loyal to the motherland, safeguarding peace, being brave and professional, enforcing laws in a civilized way" in performing its duties of fighting against crimes, protecting human rights and rebuilding local law-enforcement forces, in actively undertaking such works as patrol, community police affairs, cases investigation, dealing with mass contingency events and training local police, and in participating such special missions as confiscating weapons, demobilizing illegal troops and aiding and assisting refugees. They have excellently accomplished various missions



assigned by UN, making prominent contributions to safeguarding world peace and stabil ity. Recognized as the most strictly disciplined and most qualified team as a whole with most harmonious relationship with the local, all of them have been awarded UN Peace Medal, win ning extensive applause of the United Nations, local governments, people and foreign police counterparts. 8 Chinese peacekeeping police officers died on duty in a sudden earthquake in Haiti on 12 January, 2010, sacrificing their precious lives for the sacred cause of safeguard ing world peace and stability.

Eminence stems from a decade of diligence and struggles. At this memorable moment, let's focus on every wonderful moment of the peacekeeping police, and convey to the world Chinese Government's persistent pursuit of "a harmonious world" and Chinese people's peace—loving tradition and virtue. Let's remember for ever these pain—taking and glorious Chinese peacekeeping police for their struggles for world peace.

It is no doubt that the pain—taking experiences of Chinese peacekeeping police will not only impress the participating peacekeeping police themselves, but also encourage more and more people to actively participate in the sacred cause of safeguarding world peace, and enable more and more readers to know clearly the glorious mission the Chinese peacekeeping police undertake and how much they have contributed to and sacrificed for the mission.

Chinese Government will consistently support UN peacekeeping operations, and continue to send competent peacekeeping police to participate in UN peacekeeping operations to make more contributions to safeguarding world peace and building "a harmonious world."



Selection and Training of Chinese Peacekeeping Police

Chinese peacekeeping police work is administrated by the Ministry of Public Security. The training of peacekeeping police is organized and conducted by China Peacekeeping Police Training Center (CPPTC). Peacekeeping police are selected in the nationwide range. Since 2007, peacekeeping police teams have been established by provincial—level police departments independently. So far, 10 provincial—level police departments have established peacekeeping police contingent independently. Contents of peacekeeping police selection and training include six aspects: test of foreign language ability (listening, speaking, reading and writing), driving skills, weapon usage and shooting, physical stamina test, psychological test and interview. The contents of the three—month training include 20 subjects such as automobilism, weapons and shooting, UN peacekeeping operation, mission area background, criminal investigation, communication, map reading, mine prevention, first aid, international law, humanitarian relief, human rights and law implementation, tropical diseases prevention and treatment, security awareness, psychological adjustment, negotiation skills and simulation exercises etc.

According to UN provisions, a peacekeeping police officer must pass the selection test and get the peacekeeping police qualification before he or she can be sent to a mission area. The selection test contents include foreign language ability (listening, speaking, reading and writing), driving skills, weapon usage and shooting. Any failure of them leads to elimination. Since 2000, the United Nations has sent personnel 16 times successively to China to conduct the selection tests.






Foreign Language Training







Driving Training


















Shooting Training
