

前言

词汇是英语学习的难点:难学,难记,难用。学英语的人一般都有此感受。 作为大学英语教学大纲的一个重要组成部分,词汇表深受学生的欢迎,原 因在于它不仅标明了难度级别,更重要的是它使得大学英语词汇学习变得可 望又可及。自然而然地,许多学生乐于背词汇表。然而,其中的苦处自不待言。

啃词汇表不仅辛苦,还有一些弊端。我们所看到的词汇表通常都是按字母顺序排列单词,致使词与词之间显得零散、孤立,掩盖了词汇之间广泛存在的联系。更糟糕的是,词汇表上没有例句,一旦词汇表使用不当,就会导致学了、记了却用不了。

《大学英语词汇分类联想》基于一门语言中的词汇是由若干语义场组成的、充满内在联系的整体这一认识,将词汇表中开列的单词重新组装,帮助学习者在词汇与客观经验之间建立联系。这种用从客观经验到词汇的路线取代从词汇到意义的路线,可以使词汇学习成为既有意义又有必要的活动。心理学研究表明,分类学习法容易激发联想,减轻学习负担。我们分类所用的词汇表为教育部新近颁布的《大学英语教学大纲词汇表》(高等教育出版社,上海外语教育出版社,2000),我们在设立语义分类标准时主要参照《朗文多功能分类词典》(Longman Lexicon of Contemporary English,T. McArthur, Longman Group Limited/上海外语教育出版社,1997)以及《同义词词林》(梅家驹等,上海辞书出版社,1983),同时结合我们多年来从事英语教学所积累的经验,在许多方面做了调整,以符合中国学生学习英语词汇的实际。英语词汇多数为多义词,而在分类时我们采取单义分类原则,这样一个多义词就出现在多个不同的语义场中。分类后的词汇表实则上也可充当英语写作词典,即使一时想不到恰切的词,只要有模糊的概念,通过查阅分类词表,便可轻松获得所需的词。为便于查阅,我们还特意在书后设置了按字母顺序排列的6000多词汇的索引。

《大学英语词汇分类详解》是本系列丛书中的重点。我们仔细斟酌分类得来的语义场,从中国学生学英语的实际出发,遴选部分难用易混词汇,进行系统讲解和分类比较,从而帮助学习者克服知与行的矛盾。该书共设 10 篇,120个单元。每个单元设"学习目标"、"学习要点"和"词语辨析"三部分。"学习目标"列出本语义场中的同义词或近义词。"学习要点"对同义词汇进行多方位解

析,除给出单词音标、词性外,每个单词视情况下设【派生】、【结构】、【搭配】、【联想】等四项,其中,【结构】和【搭配】以例句具体表现该词的常用结构特点和习惯搭配情况;【联想】主要涉及反义、形似、声似等联想词汇;"词语辨析"对本单元里触及的易混词汇进行简明扼要的辨析。

《大学英语词汇分类训练》针对词汇分类,汇编大量的习题,通过分类训练,巩固分类记忆和分类学习的成果,提高学习者运用词汇的熟练程度。共设 10 个单元,由"多项选择"、"词语匹配"、"词汇派生"、"用法改错"、"拼写改错"等形式组成,书后附练习答案和索引。每个单元的练习量取决于相关单元所涉及的词汇的数量和特点。本书的特点在于"全面"、"综合"。所谓"全面",是指该习题系统覆盖大学英语阶段所需掌握的重点词汇;所谓"综合",是指练习涉及学习这些重点词汇时所应把握的各个主要方面(包括拼写、语义、结构等方面)。这些模拟词汇练习有助于四、六级英语考生及考研生备考。

本系列丛书具有以下特点:

- 一、更新视角:改变传统的零散学习方式,摆脱教科书和词典的束缚,对所有级别的大学英语词汇进行语义分类,将它们置于各种联系当中,其意义在于建立词汇与认知之间的关系,作用在于激发联想,增强记忆。同时,按语义分类的编排方式,将十分有利于学习者的口头与书面表达。
- 二、切中实际:结合编者多年从事英语学习与教学的体会以及他人的研究成果,有针对性地选择讲练那些可能会对中国学生构成不等难度的词汇。这样,学好本书内容即可基本掌握大学英语四、六级及六级后词汇。可以说,本书这样编排将大大减轻学生学习英语词汇的心理负担,可望取得事半功倍之效。
- 三、方便读者:讲解力避烦琐、含糊,能用一句话讲清的就不用两句话,提高读者的理解率。正文后附词汇索引便于读者查阅。
