

### About the Author

Eleanor Hodgman Porter was born in New Hampshire in 1868. She didn't spend much time in school during her childhood, because her family believed that being outdoors would make her stronger!

She loved music. After completing her studies at the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, she became a choir leader, singer and teacher.

When she was 24 years old, Eleanor married John Lyman Porter. They traveled to Tennessee and later settled in New York. Eleanor began to publish books—first short stories and then many

novels for both adults and children. She sometimes used the pen name of Eleanor Stuart.

Pollyanna, written in 1913, was Eleanor's most successful book and was widely read in many countries around the world. Eleanor wrote several other books about this little "glad" girl. In 1920, the year that Eleanor Porter died, the first film version of Pollyanna was produced.

There have been many other movie and television versions of this very successful, beloved novel.
