前 言

申奥成功和加入 WTO 给我国带来了难得的发展机遇,同时对我国各级人才的英语水平提出了更高的要求。在这种形势下,国家需要大批既精通各种专业又能够用英语进行口头交际的复合型人才。然而,尽管每年很多大学生能够通过全国大学英语四、六级考试(CET-4,CET-6),但大多数大学生的英语口语水平还是很低的,这一现状不能适应我国进一步改革开放的需要。


为了贯彻好教育部 2004 年颁布的《大学英语教学要求(试行)》方案,解决大学生中普遍存在的"哑巴英语"问题,我们设计了教育部立项的《BASE 方案》(项目编号: 126303222),并于 2005 年通过了该研究项目选题的评审。

《BASE 方案》(BASE Program)中的"BASE"一词是由英语"Being Able to Speak English"的几个词的首字母组成,意思是"能够说英语";"BASE"一词在英语中还有"基础"的意思。因此,"BASE"一词在这里的含义是"能够说英语是用英语进行交际的基础"。

《BASE 方案》以"训练有素"为目标,以"微观抓基本功(语音、单词和句子),宏观抓能力(口头交际能力)"为原则,既强调英语语言的运用,又注重培养社会交往中所需要的文化因素和人格因素。

《BASE 方案》的教学方法和测试方法均以"准确(accuracy)加流利(fluency)"为标准,取听说法和交际法之长,主要采用机械表达(模仿对话和朗读诗歌等)、半机械表达(复述故事和情景对话)和自由表达(讨论和辩论等)三种模式。教学设计不仅考虑学生的现实和未来的需要,而且还考虑学生的兴趣、文化背景和哲理性等因素。

本书是《BASE 方案》的教材,共 30 课,可供一个学期使用。书后附有辩论和讨论题目,共 40 个,供教师上课时选用。






