- 1. 收进了最新增加的 800 词汇。为方便读者使用,800 新词前标有☆符号。
- 2. 为便于读者系统地学习,清楚地记忆,全部例句按其 应选择的词汇的词性分类。
  - 3. 每类词按字母顺序排列,完全排除了同一例句、同一

义项在一书多套试题中反复使用的现象,全书 5876 个例句就 是实实在在的 5876 个词义。而且按字母顺序排列又使本书具 有词典性质,可快速查找两种词汇表中的词汇。

4. 全部答案均附有简明的汉语注释, 便于快速、准确地 掌握词汇。
