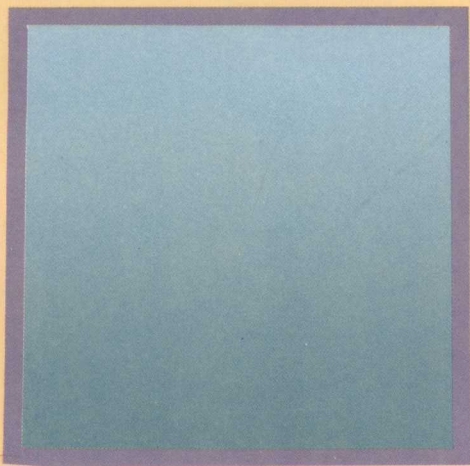


英语 正误辨异类解

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前 言

以英语为母语的学生有时也难免不在写作或会话中犯错误。以英语为外国语的学生在英语写作或会话中犯这样或那样的错误就更难免了。但难免并不等于不可避免。如何减少乃至避免在英语学习中的错误,这是摆在广大英语教师面前的一个重要问题。

《英语正误辨异类解》正是基于这一目的从词法、语法、习惯用法等方面分类罗列常见错误近600例,佐以简明扼要的讲解,试图通过罗列常见错误,查出错误根源,探明改正方法,以帮助我国大、中学生在学英语中学会正确地使用英语。

本书的一大特点是将常见错误分成十大类别,把带共同性的错句集中在一起,以便学生学习时能举一反三,触类旁通,同时也便于学生归纳记忆。本书的另一特点是,每个错误都给以讲解,根据错误的难易程度,有的讲解只寥寥数字,有的则洋洋数语,以便学生能居高临下,全面掌握,避免就错论错。

本书的例句大多摘自英语原版词书，部分来自国内公开出版的一些试题集。限于篇幅，在此不一一列出书目。

本书对大专院校学生的英语语言能力和交际能力的提高均大有帮助，对参加高考的高中生尤为重要。本书也是广大英语教师和英语自学者的一本有用的参考书。

作者虽教学多年，但在英语语言教学和学习这浩瀚大海中，还只是一个刚刚学会游泳的新手。书中缺点错误在所难免，敬希专家、同行及广大读者不吝赐教。
