

### 第3版前言

本书于 2008 年 9 月全面修订,结合最新 08 年考试情况,使 得内容更加贴近考试,词条的重要性层次更加清晰,词汇辨析更 加精确。

本书把大纲词汇按难易程度和考查范畴分为高中词汇、四级词汇、六级词汇和六级后词汇,考生可根据自身的英语水平选择合适有效的复习策略。本书打破了现在很多词汇书主次不清、难易不分、平均分配时间和精力的编排方式,从而给考生以更明确的指导,更具应试性。

本书想考生所想,在以下方面进行了精心构思:

### 1. 科学测试,合理规划复习进度

各部分词汇测试成绩与复习建议对照表,对不同程度的考生给与不同的复习建议和策略。在高中词汇、四级词汇和六级词汇前各提供了一定数量的测试题,考生在学习词汇之前可先自我测试,根据测试成绩,参照本书提供的建议和策略,制定出自己的复习计划。

注: 1. 表中所指的一个周期指将该部分没有掌握的单词完整地复习一遍所用的时间。

将每天的单词分成 2~3 个时间段来记忆,多次少量比一次多量的效果要好。并不断总结构词法,将构词法知识运用 在每个周期中, 在记单词中。 在每次记忆词汇的过程中,一定要对不同陌生程度的单词做上不同的标记。在反复记忆的过程中,一定要反复标记、反复筛选陌生词汇。

每次在记忆新词之前,一定要浏览前——天已背的词汇。背单词不是简单的重复记忆,同一个周期中,应尽可能地充分利用零碎时间, 在不同的场景下反复记忆。

背单词的第一步,最好是能够大声地朗读出来。同时也可以变换背单词的方式,如在纸上写、造句、公交车上背、写邮件……随时保 持记忆的新鲜感。

记忆新词一定要理解其含义和用法,认真研读经典例题和例句。每天的单词记忆一定要辅以大量的练习题,在运用中掌握词汇。 9
