#### 前 盲

众所周知,要学好一种语言,除了多读、多写、多实践外,还要多练"背功"——选择自己喜爱的名篇佳作反复朗读,直至烂熟于胸,这对于积累词汇,培养语感,提高阅读、写作水平和听说能力,乃至本身的素质均大有裨益。古人云:"熟读唐诗三百首,不会吟诗也会吟。""读书破万卷,下笔如有神。""腹有诗书气自华",说的就是这个道理。

为了给莘莘学子提供一份精美的精神食粮,我们从古今中外的文献典籍中,爬罗剔抉,选择了近200篇(段)文章,分为《小学篇》、《初中篇》和《高中篇》。内容涉及文学、历史、语言、哲学、经济、政治、军事、艺术和其他文化门类,林林总总,构成了生活的万花筒。读者打开此书,定会有"山阴道上,应接不暇"之感。

"厚今薄古"是本套书的编选原则。但"古人"(其实大多数离今日也不过一二百年)的文章写得流利清新、明白如话而又文采斐然的,我们也不忍割爱,酌情选入。近人和今人入选的文章须晓畅流利自不必说,但还须寓意深刻,富于哲理,言语隽永,耐人咀嚼。政坛领袖的演说也选得不少,一来演说词更接近口语,宜于诵读,易于模仿学习;二来他们眼观五洲风雨,胸有人世情怀,高屋建瓴,指点江山,墨溅珠玑,舌吐莲花,他们的声音将长久地在历史的长廊里回响。寻常百姓的儿女私情和人生感悟,只要是真情实感,我们也采撷若干片断。总之,在这套选本中,革命导师、哲学家、文学家、科学家、军事家……从国家元首、文人学者到升斗小民,聚集一堂,谈人生、社会、理想、事业,谈责任、治学、工作、处世,无不深中

肯綮,读来给人启迪,益人神智。


