## 前　　言

根据高等学校外语专业教学指导委员会所编制的最新教学大纲，大学英语专业一年级学生和大学非英语专业学生必须把听懂 VOA 作为一项基本听力要求。具体要求是：听懂 VOA 慢速新闻广播和文化节目，抓住主要内容，能在 15 分钟内听写根据已学知识编写而成或选用的录音材料（词数 150 个左右，念四遍，语速为每分钟 100 个单词，错误率不超过 10%）。

本书听力材料为标准美国英语，语音标准、清晰、优美，速度适中，而且不带任何美国地方口音，所以它既是上乘的听力材料，又是喜爱美语口音者的最佳模仿材料。

本书包含八个栏目，分别是：“美国百图”（American Mosaic），这是一个内容比较丰富的栏目，包括美国经济、社会、文化及美国人熟知的成语故事、历史故事、人文景观等等，语汇丰富；“社会发展”（Development Report），报道美国及世界各国在科学、人文、经济、产业等各个方面取得的进步，报道人们正在形成的最新观念；“环境保护”（Environment Report），这是当今的热门话题，也是各国科学家的科研重点，涵盖 TOEFL、GRE、中国的大学四、六级英语考试的词汇，对学生扩大词汇以及增强对这些词汇的听力理解、语篇理解有很大帮助；“异域探索”（Exploration），讲述一些尖端领域的新发现，例如医学、生物学、天文学等新发现，拓宽人们的视野，使人们重新认识世界；“风云人物”（People in America），讲述美国现代和历史上为国家作出独特贡献的人物故事，使您对这些人物有感性的了解；“科学报道”（Science Report），报道科技领域新成果，一些词典上还未出现的新词会在这里出现；“世界报道”（World Report），这些新闻特写报道世界各地的发展进步，也曝光世界的黑暗面，涉及生活、文化方面的词汇较多；“美国

历史”(American History),以浅显、生动的语言,讲述发生在美  
国历史上的重大事件,听来如闻其声,如见其人,帮助您了解美国  
的过去。

本书根据材料编出数种题型,有选择题、填充题、简答题、是非  
判断题、表格填充题等等,各种题型都是针对初级听力中的难点设  
计的,如数字、常见地名、人名理解等。本书针对听力要素,即  
“What, Who, Why, How, Where, When”,培养系统科学的  
听力理解习惯,有助于听者达到中级听力程度。中学高年级、大学  
低年级学生可以把它当作听力辅助教材。本书也适用于自学听力  
人士。

作为同等难度的听力材料,本书无听力难易之差,各篇之间的  
差别在于篇幅略有不同,词汇涉及面各有偏重。本书帮助您尽快  
听懂美国之音的特别英语节目,它的词汇全部在这个节目的词汇  
范围内。

全书分为文字部分和录音部分。文字部分就在本书中,书的  
前半部分是生词和练习题,后半部分是录音的文字材料和练习答  
案。您在使用中可先熟悉词汇,再根据词汇猜测将会听到的内容,  
然后听录音。各人的学习方法不同,最普通的做法是听一遍,然后  
做习题;再听一遍,修正补充已做的习题,至多听两至三遍,做完全  
部习题,个别填充题可以反复听。本书配有录音磁带,预计听完全  
书需半个学期。

在本书的编辑和录音带的制作过程中,编者得到了苏州大学  
外国语学院电教室主任、高级工程师石以人老师在网络和软件等  
技术方面给予的大力支持,在此表示衷心的感谢。
