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写在前面的话

阅读技巧常常被等同于应试技巧，等同于取巧，这其实是一种误解。阅读技巧是国内外教学专家们（尤其是英美教学专家）经过多年研究，总结出来的科学的阅读技能。掌握了这种技巧，在具有一定的词汇量和语法知识的基础上（国内高中英语或以上水平），读者就能在阅读中更迅速、更有效地获取信息，享受阅读的乐趣。有乐趣就促进多读，多读又促进理解，理解好了又更有乐趣，这样相辅相成，英语水平的提高自然水到渠成。

雅思阅读考试与传统考试有所不同，重点在于测试考生提取、理解、分析信息的能力，不直接考查语法和词汇，而是考查考生综合运用语言的能力。在这种考试中，掌握阅读技巧比死记硬背更有用武之地。

市面上关于英语阅读和雅思阅读的书出了不少，有些太繁琐，太学术化，适合指导教师作为教学参考资料，专业有余而趣味不足；有些还是按照传统的思路编写——提供文章，罗列单词表，分析难句；还有一些只针对某一种阅读考试设计内容，显然把阅读技巧狭隘化了。针对这种情况，本书把阅读技巧的学习和使用结合起来，先学习技巧，再运用到雅思阅读考试中。笔者根据多年的英语阅读和雅思教学经验，将本书分为“阅读技巧学习篇”和“雅思阅读考试实践篇”两大部分。第一部分分为九章，详细介绍了各种英语阅读技巧，并结合雅思题型讲解阅读技巧在雅思阅读考试中的应用。第二部分分为五章，包括雅思考试的测试要求、题型分类、具体题型以及雅思阅读考试真题破解等内容。

科学的阅读技巧适用于任何类型的阅读考试。本书介绍的技巧同样适用于其他类型的英语考试，包括高考、大学英语考试、专业英语考试、新托福、GRE 和 GMAT 等。除此之外，阅读技巧也适用于生活、学习和工作。通过学习阅读技巧可以一举多得，使学习者（包括高中生、大学非英语专业学生、英语专业学生、研究生和需要参加雅思等留学考试的考生）能够突破英语阅读的“瓶颈”，终生受用。同时，英语教师也可借鉴此书，提高教学水平。

最后，笔者希望与广大考生共同分享英语阅读的经验，切实提高考生的英语阅读水平，从而在雅思阅读考试中获取高分！

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1 寻读——提取细节信息快捷方便

1.1 寻读技巧概述

不同的阅读目的决定不同的阅读动作。要在文本中迅速找到所需的细节信息是不必通读全文的，因为这些信息在文中是孤立存在的，不与其他信息发生横向的联系。信息的性质决定阅读的方式，逐字、逐句、逐行的阅读不能达到快速从文本中找到所需信息的目的。在这里，提高速度是首要问题。

严格说来，寻读（scanning）并不是阅读，而是通过眼睛的快速移动来搜寻信息。在寻读开始前，必须确定寻找目标，比如在词典中查生词，在报纸分类广告中找工作、租房、买房、找各种娱乐活动信息、确定旅游地点等，或在期刊杂志、书籍和百科全书目录中很快找到要读的文章、章节和信息。在阅读考试中，针对要求回答细节信息的题目，考生则要先读问题，确定寻找目标，再记住与所需信息有关的关键词，然后快速移动眼球，发现与信息相关的关键词在文中的位置，阅读上下文，就会找到所需内容。用这种方法来寻找细节信息，回答关于细节信息的问题，会大大提高答题速度，为完成其他类型的题目争取更多的时间。

1.2 寻读技巧专项训练

基本上每个人都会查词典，但你有没有想过，学会查词典就相当于掌握了寻读这个快捷提取信息的技巧。寻读本身是一种学习的技能；把它用在阅读考试中，它就变成了阅读技能；用在生活和工作中，它又成为了生活和工作技能。

请看查词典的步骤：第一，先确定目标（即要查哪个单词），譬如查 flu 这个单词；第二，根据字母顺序查到这个单词的首字母 f 在词典中的位置；第三，再根据字母顺序查到这个词在哪一页。若在页眉上查到了 flub（如下图所示），你会推断出 flu 必然就在这一页。这时候，快速移动眼球，很快就会发现 flu 是在该页右下角的倒数第二个词条。你是不会从这一页的左上角开始一行一行地读，慢慢地读到右下角才发现 flu 这个词条的，因为 flu 是单个的孤立信息，与别的词条不发生横向联系。因此要通过眼睛的快速搜寻，立刻定位，这就是寻读。

florid **DECORATED** /'flɔ:r-əd, 'flar-əd/ *adj* with too much decoration or detail • *a florid architectural style* • *florid prose/speech*

florist /'flɔ:r-əst, 'flar-/ *n* [C] a person who sells cut flowers and plants for inside the house

floss /flas, flɔ:s/ *v* [T] to clean between (your teeth) using **dental floss** (= thin thread made especially for this purpose)

floss /flas, flɔ:s/ *n* [C/U] **dental floss**, see at DENTAL

flotilla /flou'til-ə/ *n* [C] a large group of boats or small ships, esp. military ships

flounce /flauns/ *v* [I always + adv/prep] to walk quickly with large noticeable movements, esp. to attract attention or show that you are angry • *"Don't expect any help from me!" she said, as she flounced out of the room.*

flounder **MOVE AWKWARDLY** /'flaun-dər/ *v* [I] to move awkwardly or to be in an awkward or difficult situation • *She floundered around in the water.* • *He lost the next page of his speech and floundered for a few seconds.* • *His business was flourishing, but his marriage was floundering.*

flounder **FISH** /'flaun-dər/ *n* [C/U] *pl* **flounders** a flat fish that is used as food

flour /flaur/ *n* [U] powder made from grain, esp. wheat, used for making bread, cakes, pasta, pastry, etc. • *wheat/rye flour* • *three cups of flour*

flour /flaur/ *v* [T] to put a thin layer of flour on (something) • *Flour the board, then roll out the dough.*

flourish **SUCCEED** /'flɔ:r-ɪʃ/ *v* [I] to grow or develop successfully • *Parts of the city continue*

to flourish. • *This is the perfect environment for our company to flourish and expand in.*

flourish **WAVE** /'flɔ:r-ɪʃ/ *v* [T] to move (something) in your hand in order to make people look at it • *She ran up to her father, flourishing her diploma.*

flourish /'flɔ:r-ɪʃ/ *n* [C] • *I pulled into the driveway with a flourish (= a noticeable movement).*

flout /flaut/ *v* [T] to intentionally disobey (a rule or law), or to intentionally avoid (behavior that is usual or expected) • *They think they can flout the law and get away with it.* • *He conducted business in his pajamas to flout convention.*

flow /flou/ *v* [I] (esp. of liquids, gases, or electricity) to move in one direction, esp. continuously and easily • *Air flows over an aircraft's wing faster than it flows under it.* • *Lava from the volcano was flowing down the hillside.* • *An electrical current flows from positive to negative.* • *Many rivers flow into the Pacific Ocean.* • *With fewer cars on the roads, traffic is flowing (= moving forward) more smoothly than usual.* • Something can be said to flow if it hangs down loosely and attractively: *Her long, red hair flowed down over shoulders.* • (fig.) *My thoughts flow more easily (= I can think more easily) if I work on a word processor.*

flub /flab/ *v* [I/T] **-bb-** *informal* to fail or make a mistake, esp. when performing • *He really flubbed badly by not catching the ball.* [I] • *Sheila flubbed her lines in the second act.* [T]

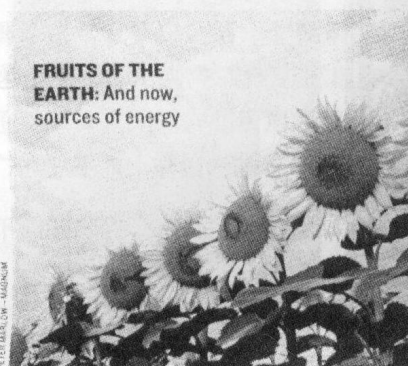

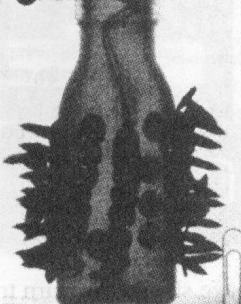

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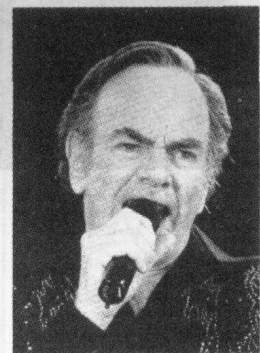
