A Dictionary of English Patterns 英语句型词典

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语言是通过句子来表达思想的。英语和汉语一样,句子有一定的结构, 遵循一定的模式。用来表达思想的句子千变万化,不胜枚举,不过,我们把 这些句子综合归纳一下,可以找出其中规律性的东西。就句子使用的目的 而言,我们可以把句子分为陈述句、疑问句、祈使句和感叹句:就句子的结构 而言.我们可以把句子分为简单句、并列句和复合句:就句子中主语和谓语 的位置而言,我们可以把句子分为顺装语序句和倒装语序句,等等。以上这 些是语法讨论的范畴。学习和掌握英语,必须要了解这些基本的句式。但 是,仅仅了解这些基本句式还远远不够。英语是表达方式极其多样的一种 语言,一种意念可以运用多种方式表达;一种表达方式在不同的场合、运用 不同的词汇和修辞手段,又可以表达不同的意念。英语词汇极其丰富,能够 表达各种不同的细微意思。但是,无论是短语还是句子,其中都有一两个中 心词,这些词在句子中的作用,好比梁柱一样支撑着房屋,用一定的模式,平 衡前后左右词与词之间的关系,构成意思正确、语法合理的句子。我们把这 些词叫做"heavy-duty words"。在句子中,这些 heavy-duty words 通常是由动 词、名词、形容词、副词等实词来充当的,尤其是动词。动词运用各种时态、 语态和语气,可以表达人们的各种意念、态度、情感、情绪等。 句子中的谓语 是句子的灵魂,而谓语一般是由动词或者动词短语担任的。谓语动词的形 式,决定了句子的基本模式;谓语动词与其他词的固定搭配,体现出句子的 个性和特征。请看下面两个句子:

The doctor advised her to take more exercise.

The doctor suggested her taking more exercise.

这两个句子的意思都是:医生建议她多参加运动,但是因为谓语动词不同,它们的宾语部分也就不一样。

这本《英语句型词典》的正文部分是以句子的中心词为词目,展示它们在句子中的各种固定搭配,展示它们在句子中的各种习惯用法。这里所说的中心词与其他词的固定搭配,是指那些能构成句子骨架的短语,单纯的固定词组一般不收入本词典。作为词目的中心词大部分是动词,是不难理解的。英语中很多动词既是及物动词(vt.),又是不及物动词(vi.);作为及物

动词所构成的最基本、最常见的句型是:"主语+谓语动词+直接宾语"(S+v.+O.),作为不及物动词的最基本、最常见的句型是:"主语+谓语动词"(S+v.),这是不言而喻的,因此以上这两种句型一般都不列入正文。但是,在动词的词目后,我们仍然将 vt.或 vi.都标注出来,以便让读者全面了解该动词的用法。另外,值得提出的是,作谓语的及物动词一般都可以用作被动语态,这种被动语态的句型如果没有特定的附带结构,一般也不列出。本书正文部分是按词目的字母顺序编排的,查阅起来比较方便。本书的附录部分列出英语句型分类,分别介绍动词句型(VP)、名词句型(NP)和形容词句型(AP),有一定的实用价值。

我们希望本书对读者学习和使用英语有一定的帮助。由于编者水平有限,加上时间仓促,书中一定有一些缺点和错误,请读者指正。
