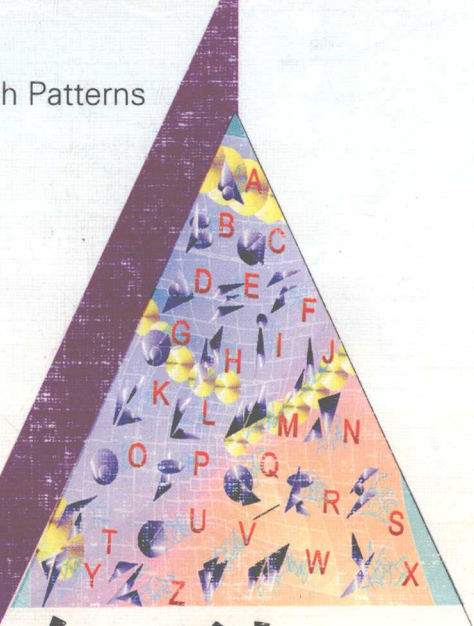

A Dictionary of English Patterns 英语句型词典

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前 言

语言是通过句子来表达思想的。英语和汉语一样,句子有一定的结构,遵循一定的模式。用来表达思想的句子千变万化,不胜枚举,不过,我们把这些句子综合归纳一下,可以找出其中规律性的东西。就句子使用的目的而言,我们可以把句子分为陈述句、疑问句、祈使句和感叹句;就句子的结构而言,我们可以把句子分为简单句、并列句和复合句;就句子中主语和谓语的位置而言,我们可以把句子分为顺装语序句和倒装语序句,等等。以上这些是语法讨论的范畴。学习和掌握英语,必须要了解这些基本的句式。但是,仅仅了解这些基本句式还远远不够。英语是表达方式极其多样的一种语言,一种意念可以运用多种方式表达;一种表达方式在不同的场合、运用不同的词汇和修辞手段,又可以表达不同的意念。英语词汇极其丰富,能够表达各种不同的细微意思。但是,无论是短语还是句子,其中都有一两个中心词,这些词在句子中的作用,好比梁柱一样支撑着房屋,用一定的模式,平衡前后左右词与词之间的关系,构成意思正确、语法合理的句子。我们把这些词叫做“heavy-duty words”。在句子中,这些 heavy-duty words 通常是由动词、名词、形容词、副词等实词来充当的,尤其是动词。动词运用各种时态、语态和语气,可以表达人们的各种意念、态度、情感、情绪等。句子中的谓语是句子的灵魂,而谓语一般是由动词或者动词短语担任的。谓语动词的形式,决定了句子的基本模式;谓语动词与其他词的固定搭配,体现出句子的个性和特征。请看下面两个句子:

The doctor advised her to take more exercise.

The doctor suggested her taking more exercise.

这两个句子的意思都是:医生建议她多参加运动,但是因为谓语动词不同,它们的宾语部分也就不一样。

这本《英语句型词典》的正文部分是以句子的中心词为词目,展示它们在句子中的各种固定搭配,展示它们在句子中的各种习惯用法。这里所说的中心词与其他词的固定搭配,是指那些能构成句子骨架的短语,单纯的固定词组一般不收入本词典。作为词目的中心词大部分是动词,是不难理解的。英语中很多动词既是及物动词(*vt.*),又是不及物动词(*vi.*);作为及物

动词所构成的最基本、最常见的句型是：“主语 + 谓语动词 + 直接宾语”(S + v. + O.)，作为不及物动词的最基本、最常见的句型是：“主语 + 谓语动词”(S + v.)，这是不言而喻的，因此以上这两种句型一般都不列入正文。但是，在动词的词目后，我们仍然将 *vt.* 或 *vi.* 都标注出来，以便让读者全面了解该动词的用法。另外，值得提出的是，作谓语的及物动词一般都可以用作被动语态，这种被动语态的句型如果没有特定的附带结构，一般也不列出。本书正文部分是按词目的字母顺序编排的，查阅起来比较方便。本书的附录部分列出英语句型分类，分别介绍动词句型(VP)、名词句型(NP)和形容词句型(AP)，有一定的实用价值。

我们希望本书对读者学习和使用英语有一定的帮助。由于编者水平有限，加上时间仓促，书中一定有一些缺点和错误，请读者指正。
