

"中国学生英语文库"是一套由商务印书馆专门为我国学生精心设计编辑的英语读物文库,首批推出100种英汉对照简易读物。

首批100种分四辑出版,第一辑为世界经典童话故事(20种),第二辑为优秀科普简易读物(22种),第三辑为世界名人故事(10种),第四辑为世界经典文学简易读物(48种)。前两辑的读者对象为小学生,后两辑的读者对象为中学生。全四辑英汉对照,图文并茂,知识性强,通俗易懂,引人入胜。

第一辑精选了 20 种美丽动人的经典童话故事,既给人以丰富的想象又陶冶人的心灵,让人在童话的世界里感受真善美。第二辑精选了 22 种颇具代表性的科普作品,不仅给人以科学新知,唤起人们对科学的兴趣,更让人享受到阅读的愉悦。第三辑精选了 10 种广为流传的世界名人故事,一个个传奇人生,一幅幅成功画卷,无一不激励人生,催人奋进。第四辑精选了 48 种最为脍炙人口的世界文学名著简写本,对人们开阔眼界、陶冶情操、丰富个性、提高素质大有裨益。




The Nightingales lived in a house in Derbyshire. It was a very big house, but not big enough for Mrs Nightingale.

Florence was, though, thanks to her father.




Florence's mother was worried. "No one likes CLEVER girls!" she said. "Piano playing, embroidery, flower arranging — that's what Florence needs to learn!"

But Florence would grow up to do a lot more than flower arranging.




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When Florence was seventeen the Nightingales went to Europe again. They visited many different places and had lots of fun.
