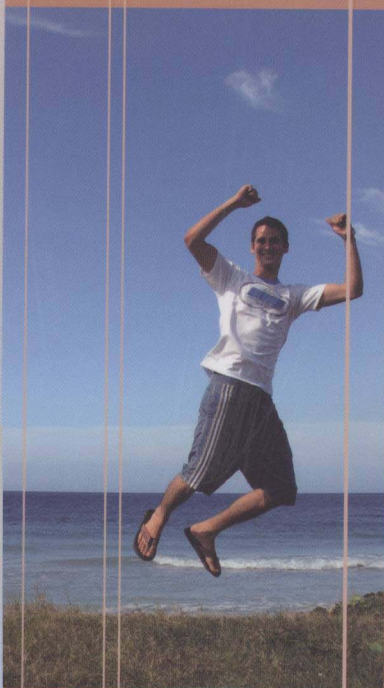

# 前 言

《新编实用英语视听说教程》是在McGraw-Hill公司出版的*The ICON DVD Program*基础上, 结合国家对高职高专学生英语听说能力的新要求改编而成的。本系列教材包括《新编实用英语视听说初级教程》(以下简称《初级教程》)上、下两册、《新编实用英语视听说中级教程》(以下简称《中级教程》)上、下两册及《新编实用英语视听说初级教程教师参考书》一册和《新编实用英语视听说中级教程教师参考书》一册。

《初级教程》每分册分为12个单元, 每个单元包含两部分: 第一部分为一段与单元主题相关的幽默短剧, 短剧的对话中还融进了该单元的关键词语和句型; 第二部分是一个包含一系列问答的访谈节目, 节目仍然围绕单元主题展开。《中级教程》每分册同样分为12个单元, 每个单元也包含两部分: 第一部分为一个四口之家(父亲、母亲、女儿、儿子)围绕某一主题展开的会话; 第二部分则是一段主题相同的新闻录像。由于《中级教程》第一部分的会话包含了与第二部分的新闻录像相关的语言和背景知识, 因此可激发学生对新闻节目的兴趣, 同时也有助于他们更好地理解新闻节目的内容。

本视听说系列教材是在大量的理论研究和多年的教学实践基础上编写而成的。其编写特色主要表现在以下几个方面:

## 1. 单元结构循序渐进

各单元都按以下循序渐进的原则进行设计: 单元的第一部分都为第二部分的内容做好了铺垫。每一部分的练习设计是按先做语言和内容的准备, 然后进行视听; 先了解节目大意, 然后再理解细节; 先进行语言输入, 然后再安排语言输出的步骤进行。这样就形成了一环套一环、层层递进的单元结构。

## 2. 活动设计形式多样

编者在各单元都设计了形式多样的语言练习和语言交际活动。有的活动采用多项选择的形式, 有的则采用回答问题或完成对话的形式; 有的活动为观看录像做语言和内容上的准备, 有的则基于录像内容锻炼学生的口头表达能力。各单元在总体结构上保持一致, 但在活动形式上有所不同。

## 3. 重点突出肢体语言

人类的交际虽然在很大程度上是语言行为, 但人们的肢体动作在面对面的交际过程中也往往扮演非常重要的角色。本教材的各个单元都设计了专门的练习, 帮助学生观察和学习使用恰当的肢体语言, 以取得更好的交际效果。

## 4. 教材版式图文并茂

纸质教材采用全彩印刷, 并配有大量图片。这种呈现形式可以对使用者产生理想的视觉冲击, 加深学生对所述文字的理解。

## 5. DVD光盘操作方便

本书配有一张原版引进的DVD光盘, 光盘中配有简便的导航系统。使用者可以根据教材内容便捷地在光盘上找到相关的录像。

《新编实用英语视听说教程》的总主编为南京大学的王海啸教授和东南大学的李霄翔教授, 《中级教程(上)》的主编是李霄翔, 编者(以姓氏笔画为序)为: 朱萍、胡庭山。希望本系列教材能够帮助大家在轻松、愉快的氛围中提高英语的听说能力, 同时也请大家对本教材的设计和编写提出宝贵的意见和建议, 我们将不胜感激。

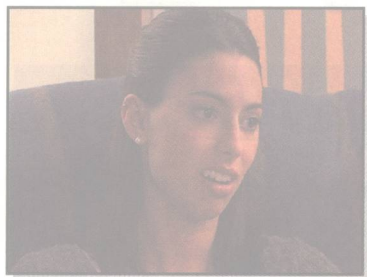

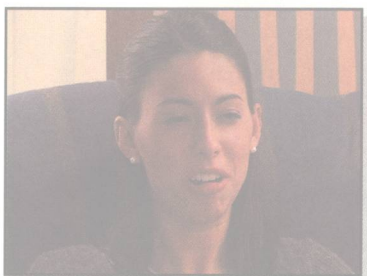

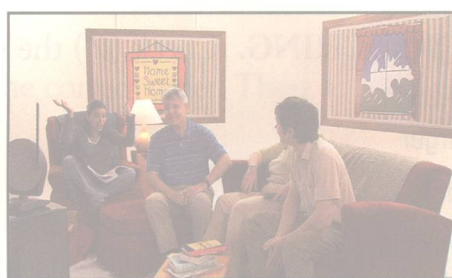

姓氏通常是取生父姓氏作为自己的姓氏, 英文称之为“family name”或“last name”。

PR: public relations 公共关系

# The FIFA World Cup

**T**he Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) is an international soccer association. Since 1930, it has sponsored the FIFA World Cup tournament every four years. The tournament final includes 32 countries and is the most widely-viewed sporting event in the world, even **surpassing** the Olympic Games. In **nearly** eight decades of

the tournament, only seven countries have won: Argentina, Brazil, England, France, Germany, Italy, and Uruguay. Of these nations, Brazil, with five **victories**, has won the most times. You might note that all of these teams are from Europe or South America. In fact, the only two teams ever to **advance** to the semifinals from outside of these continents are the USA in 1930 and South Korea in 2002.

In 2002, the South Korean team made big news when it **defeated** former World Cup champions, Italy, and made it into the quarterfinals. After that, it was successful in defeating Spain, which put it into the semifinals against Germany. It was there that the team lost.
