前 言

根据教育部规定,自 2002 年起全国硕士研究生入学考试的英语考试增加了 20%的听力测试内容作为参考分,从 2003 年开始英语试卷中听力部分的分数计入总分,而且听力在试卷中的比例最终会增加到 30%。听力部分的增加提高了研究生入学考试的难度,成为新的难点和重点。为此,我们编写了这本《考研英语听力强化训练》。

硕士研究生英语入学考试的听力部分在形式和内容上不同于 全国大学英语四、六级考试,既设有客观题,也设有主观题,因此 要求考生不仅具备一定的选择判断能力,还要具备一定的英语表达 能力。

本书主要以参加全国硕士研究生入学英语考试的考生及参加 全国 MBA 联考的考生为对象,紧扣最新考试大纲及真题发展动向, 针对考试中重点及难点,科学系统地、全方位地、深入浅出地编排 了分项训练,希望通过大量的练习和模拟训练帮助考生解决普遍存 在的"听懂了内容,却不会将听到的信息按要求记录和表达"的问 题,使考生在扎实精练的基础上,快速突破英语听力这一难关。

本书分为六大部分。第一部分介绍大纲要求。第二部分为 Part A 专项训练。本部分共编写了 25 项练习,内容覆盖全面,包括文化、环境、住宿、天气预报、新闻报道、工作学习、旅游度假、人物地理介绍等。此部分还根据大纲要求,精心策划了年代、日期、时间、金额等从个位数到千万位数字及常用词汇拼写练习。通过本部分的系统训练,考生必会提高对数字的反应能力并掌握常用而易于拼写错误的词汇;第三部分为 Part B 专项训练,共设有 20 篇练习题。第四部分为 Part C 专项训练,共有 18 套练习题。Part B 及

Part C 两部分着重提高考生在听长段独白或对话过程中确认正确选项与归纳信息、回答问题的能力;第五部分为三套模拟试题,严格按照最新考研大纲要求编写而成。作者对近几年研究生入学考试实考试题及样题做了深入细致的研究和总结,将实考试题的内在规律渗透于本部分的模拟试题当中。第六部分为研究生入学英语听力部分历年实考试题,旨在让考生亲身感受实际考试题目的形式、难度,并检验通过系统训练后是否在听力上有所提高。每一部分的听力书面材料均选自国外最新报刊、文摘、科普读物及听力教材,与考研听力材料难度及形式极为贴近。每一部分后均附有标准答案。

本书配有 4 盘听力录音磁带,内容权威,名师主笔。本书作者 多年从事研究生入学考试及专业学位入学考试的命题研究和考前 辅导,深谙命题原则、思路与动态。因此,本书是结合多年命题研究经验编写而成的高水平辅导书,极具权威性、实战性和指导性,是考研及全国 MBA 联考考生们提高英语听力应试能力的首选辅导教材。

本书在编写过程中结合了多方面人士的意见和建议,得到了清华大学出版社等单位有关人员的大力支持和帮助。责任编辑孙建春老师,对本书进行了认真审阅并提出了许多宝贵意见和建议,在此深表谢意。

第一部分 概 述

一、考研英语大纲对考生在听力理解部分的技能要求

《全国硕士研究生入学考试英语考试大纲》对考生听力理解的 要求是考生不仅应能听懂日常生活中的通知、讲话、一般性谈话或 讨论等,还应能听懂所熟悉的广播电视节目、讲座、演讲和论述等。 根据所听材料,考生应能:

- (1) 理解主旨要义:
- (2) 获取事实性的具体信息:
- (3) 理解明确或隐含表达的概念性含义;
- (4) 进行有关的判断、推理和引申;
- (5) 理解说话者的意图、观点或态度。

二、全国硕士研究生人学考试英语考试听力理解部分的考 试特点

全国硕士研究生入学考试英语考试听力理解的录音材料朗读速度每分钟为 160~180 单词,已经非常接近日常英语口语的正常语速,英语口语的基本特点体现无遗,如"连读"、"失去爆破"、"省音"、"语调"、"节奏"等等。从题材方面来讲,研究生入学英语考试听力理解部分内容涉猎面广,强调考生的语言应用能力,涉及了英语国家的社会文化、人际关系、家庭、代沟、年轻人、日常生活方式、城市与乡村生活、媒体、饮食、法律与秩序、宗教信仰、健康与保健、工作与娱乐、机会均等、就业与失业、体育运动、业余

活动、旅游、教育、文化生活/文化遗产、战争与和平、发展中世界、科技与医学进步、技术创新、环境、资源保护、环境污染等内容,可谓"包罗万象,极为广泛"。

三、全国硕士研究生人学考试英语考试听力理解部分的考 核内容

- (1) 研究生入学英语考试听力理解部分由 A、B、C 三节组成, 考查考生理解英语口语的能力。
 - A 节: 考查考生理解特定或具体信息(如数字、时间等)的能力。要求考生根据所听到的一段 180~220 词的独白或对话,填充表格中的空白。录音材料播放两遍。A 节共 5 道题。
 - B节: 考查考生理解具体信息或总体信息的能力。要求考生根据所听到的一段 280~320 词的独白或对话, 回答 5 道简答题。录音材料播放两遍。B节共 5 道题。
 - C节: 考查考生获取特定信息,理解主旨要义,推测、判断说话者意图、观点或态度等能力。要求考生根据所听到的三段独白或对话(每段 200~300 词),从每题所给的 4个选项中选出最佳选项。每段录音材料只播放一遍。C节共 10 道题。C节试题的提问不在录音中播放,仅在试题册上印出。
- (2) 听力考试进行时,考生先将答案写出或划在试题册上。在 听力部分结束前专门留出 5 分钟,供考生将试题册上的全部答案整 洁地誊写或转涂到答题卡(一)上。
- (3) 听力部分总题量为 20 道题,分值为每题 1 分,共 20 分,答题时间约为 30 分钟(包括誊写和转涂时间)。
