#### DESIGNING FOR THE IMAGINATION

I sometimes get asked what the difference between designing for 80,000 people in a stadium and designing for 80 people in a theatre above a pub is.

Essentially, there is no difference because, as theatre makers, the space we are designing for is the space inside the heads of our audience.

We go to the theatre, to concerts, to dance, and to opera in search of the sensation of being among a group of people who are all simultaneously responding to an invitation to imagine. It's powerful. When it works, we become part of a community of people all forming a world in our minds en masse, united in the sense of wonder at the overwhelming force of our own imaginations.

Theatre is increasingly unlike anything else most of us do most of the time; it involves a group of real live human beings expressing themselves, communicating emotions, ideas, and narratives to another group of real live human beings, in the same room, theatre, or stadium.

Theatre happens in real time in a concrete space, which is its limitation and also the source of its infinite freedom. Stage designers thrive on the physical and temporal restrictions imposed upon them by this demanding "art of the possible."

A stage designer needs to create a visual world that an audience can believe in, trust in, and enter. Audiences are incredibly visually sophisticated; they pick up the slightest visual signals, and a designer has to be quick to stay ahead of them.

It is hard to understand a stage design out of its original context. Really, you have to be there. I consider photography of this most ephemeral art form to be an art in itself. The photograph of the stage design is not the experience of the stage design. Rather, it is a residual trace of that experience and a separate but equally valid work.

Photography of stage design plays an essential role in the growth and development of the practice. It is through photographs that stage designers are able to learn from and respond to one another's work.

This is a fantastically broad and varied collection of photographs of stage designs from all over the planet that will provide a rich source of inspiration to both audiences and designers.

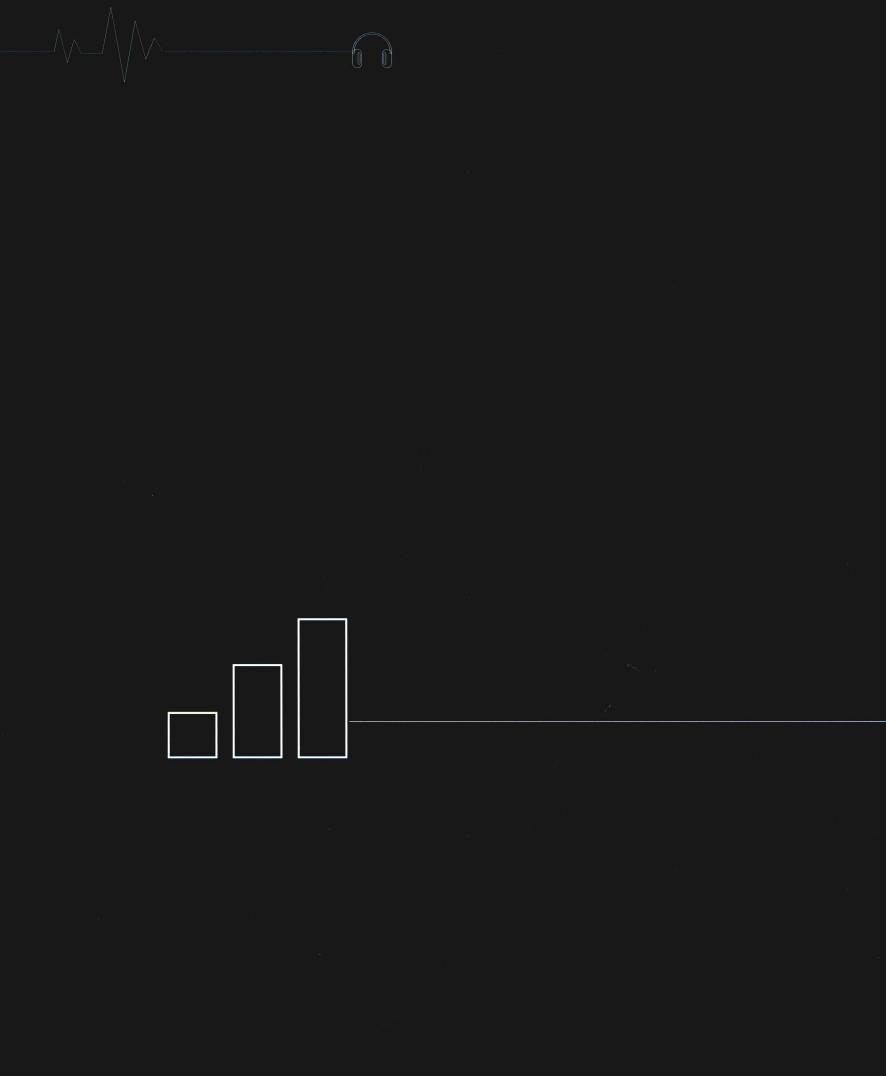

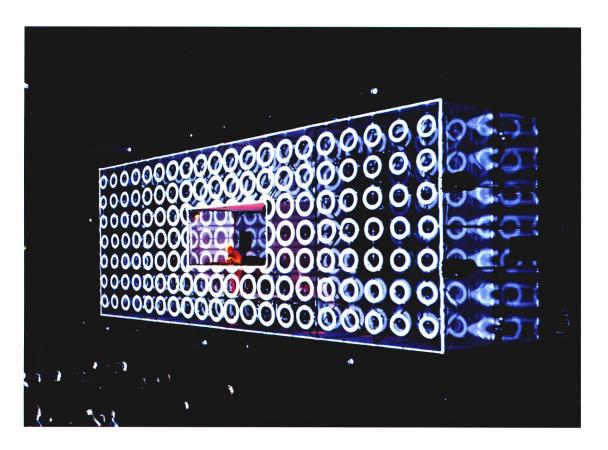

The BOOM-box is a concept that we have worked on for a long time. First created for the Amiens "Nuits blanches" in 2008, it has now been adapted to the demands of the international techno festival Godskitchen, which tours throughout the world.

We designed the BOOM-box as an oversized Ghetto Blaster in which a DJ stage takes the place of the tape recorder. It can work for any outdoor event: the Boom-box is huge, luminous, noisy, and playful.

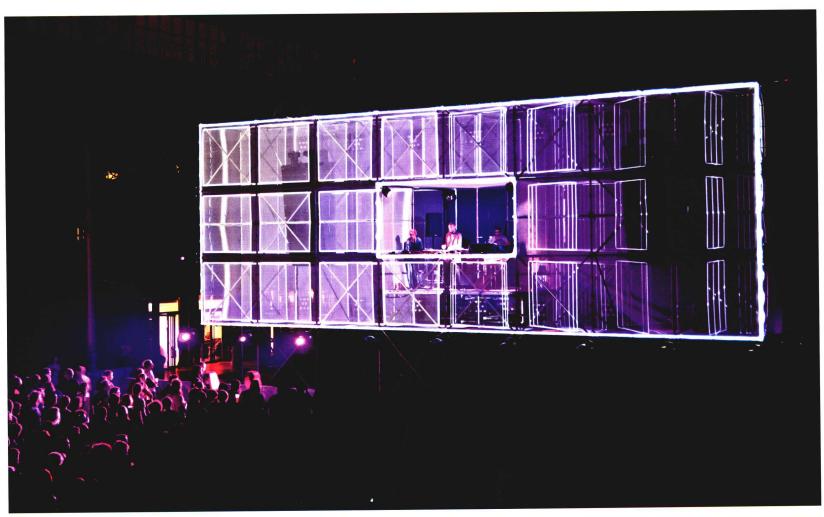
Its big scale conceals a great many details. Everything has been custommade for the show, from the 16 x 8 m scaffolding structure, to the visuals, which represent music items, such as the ghetto-blaster, the DJ record decks, and sound level displays. Architectural visuals give a depth to the stage; even the geographical position of the party can be displayed.

The interface program between sound and image, which we call the BOOM-Boxer, has also been designed from scratch to be as playful as possible, thanks to our adapted joystick control system.

The lighting design with its stroboscopes, blinders, and moving lights has also been elaborated to enhance the show.

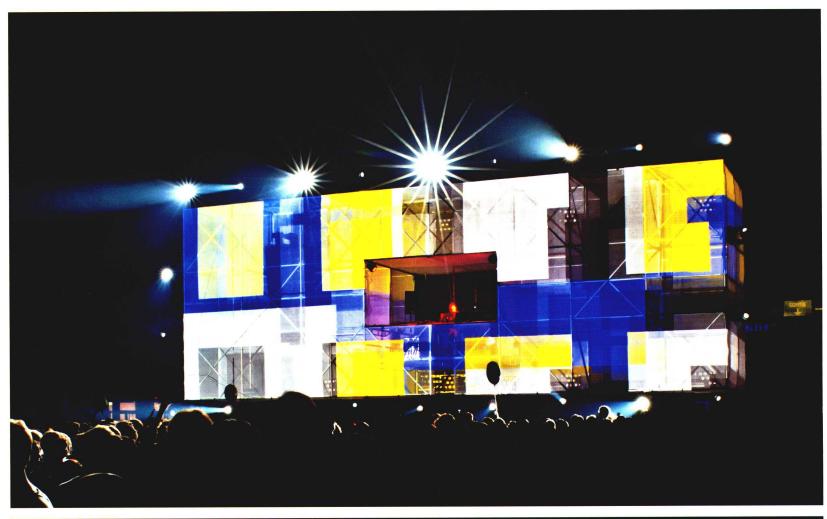


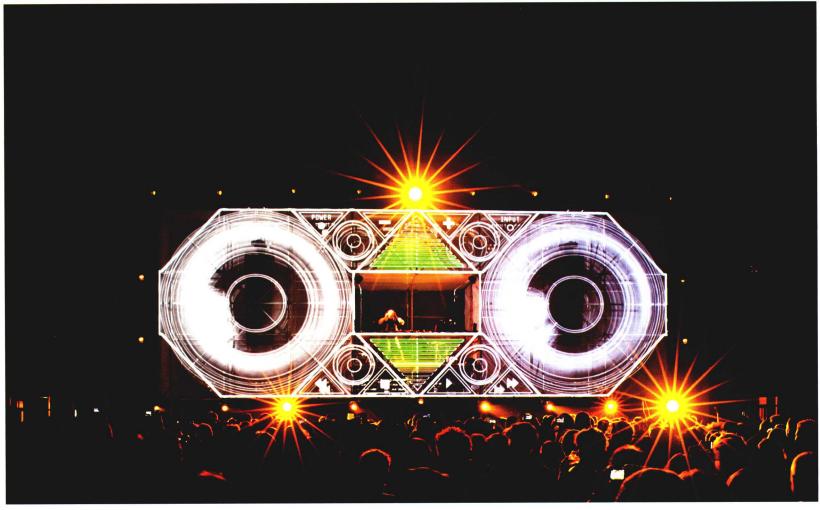

Electro Night is a huge stage and setup design for the Electro Live Night in the Grand Palais in Paris.

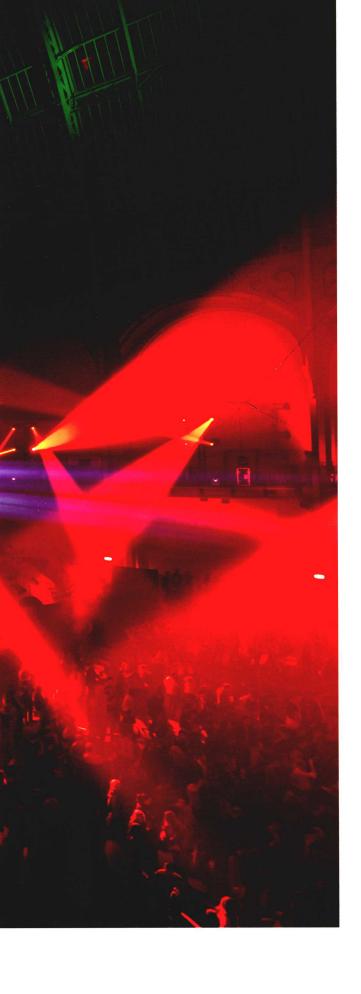
In order to fill this crazy and massive venue, they used shipping containers and a big laser and mirror setup as well as strobes and sharpy moving lights.

Electro Night can be setup in less than 24 hours for a full night party!



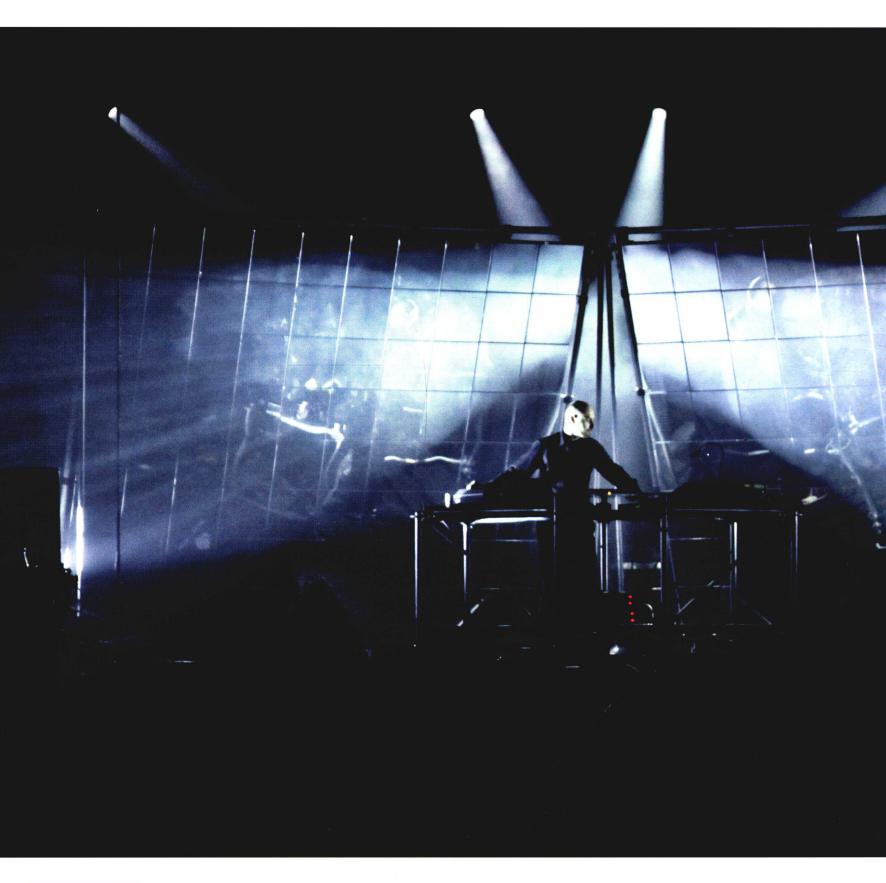
