每年一次的硕士研究生入学英语考试是全国规模的标准化测试,它与大学英语的教学密切相关,并反映出高年级或高层次学生的英语水准。随着教育领域改革开放的不断深入及社会主义市场经济体制的逐步建立,报考攻读硕士研究生学位的在校学生和在职人员逐年增加。由于自1994年起研究生入学考试英语试卷的题型以及考试重点有所变化,广大考生和辅导教师迫切需要一些针对性和标准性均强的模拟试卷,以作复习备考之用,这便促使我们在教学之余编写了此书。

"顾名思义",本书的最大特点就是"全新"。12 套模拟试卷的编写素材均选自近几年英美等国的书报杂志等,内容丰富翔实,题材广泛新颖,语言纯正适时,考生在作题时能汲取知识,拓宽视野,增加词汇。

在编写模拟试卷时我们力求一切从实战出发,严格遵循《考试 大纲》的各项要求,在题型、题量、难易度、语言点的分布及各个项 目的编排等方面尽量与 1995 年全国统考标准题保持一致。

本书可供考生作考前强化训练及自测之用,亦可作为研究生 应试辅导班的教材或辅助材料。

全国硕士研究生入学考试《英语考试大纲》

考试说明

全国硕士研究生入学考试是为高等学校招收研究生而设置的。其中,英语实行全国统一考试。它的评价标准是高等学校优秀本科毕业生能达到的及格或及格以上水平,以保证被录取者具有一定的英语水平,有利于各高等学校在专业上择优选拔。

考试对象为参加全国硕士研究生入学考试的本科应届毕业 生、大学本科毕业后工作两年以上的或具有同等学历的在职人员。

一、评价目标

考生应掌握下列语言知识和技能:

(一)词汇

考试所涉及的词汇、短语主要限于本大纲附表。

- 1. 熟练掌握 3200 个左右常用词汇及短语;
- 2. 认知 2000 个左右次常用词汇及短语。
- (二)语法知识
- I. 词法
- 1. 动词的时态、语态、语气及情态动词、非限定动词的用法;
- . 2. 名词、形容词和副词的用法;
 - 3. 介词、连词和代词的用法。
 - Ⅱ. 句法

简单句、并列句和复合句的结构及用法。

(三)阅读理解能力

考生应能综合运用英语语言知识和阅读技能来理解英语书面 材料。能以每分钟 60 词的速度阅读各种题材(社会生活、人物传记、科普、史地、政治、经济等)和体裁(议论文、记叙文、说明文、应 用文等)的文字材料。

1. 掌握所读材料的主旨和大意;

- 2. 了解用以阐述主旨的事实和有关细节;
- 3. 根据上下文判断大纲附表以外的某些词汇和短语的意义:
- 4. 既理解个别句子的意义,也理解上下文之间的逻辑关系;
- 5. 根据所读材料进行一定的判断、推理和引申;
- 6. 领会作者的观点和态度;
- 7. 正确理解英语原文并用汉语表达原文所述内容。

(四)书面表达能力

- 1. 根据题目要求写出描写、叙述、说明或议论性的短文:
- 2. 语言正确,条理清楚。
- *本考试对课程和教材不作统一规定;凡符合上述评价目标的课程及教材都适于考生的应考复习。

二、试卷结构及考试形式

试题为主客观混合型。客观题占总分的 70%,主观题占总分的 30%。本试卷共分五部分,76 题。答题时间 180 分钟。

第一部分:语法结构与词汇

40 小题,每小题 0.5 分,共 20 分。

题目分三节:

A 节:语法填空,10 题,5 分,每题为一个或二个句子,其中留有一个空白处,要求考生从所给的四个选择项中选 出一个最佳答案;

B节:语法辨错,10题,5分,每题为一个或二个句子,有四个划线部分,其中一处是错误的,要求考生将错误项选出:

C节:词语填空,20题,10分,每题为一个或二个句子,其中留有一个空白处,要求考生从所给的四个选择项中选出一个最佳答案。

第二部分:完形填空

10 小题,每小题 1 分,共 10 分。

阅读一篇短文,其中有10处空白,每处空白为一小题,每题有四个选项。要求考生在全面理解文章内容的基础上,选择一个

最佳答案,使短文的意思和结构完整、合理。

第三部分:阅读理解

20 小题,每小题 2分,共 40 分。

在五篇左右阅读材料后共列出 20 道理解判断题,总阅读量 1800 词左右。考生应根据材料内容从各题下所列的四个选项中选出 一个最佳答案。

第四部分:英译汉

5小题,每题3分,共15分。

在一篇短文中有五个划线部分,要求考生根据上下文将各划线部分译成汉语。要求内容准确、完整、语言明白。

第五部分:短文写作

1题,15分。

考生应根据题目以及写作提纲或规定情景、图表等写出不少于 120 词的短文。要求内容切题,表达清楚,意义连贯,语言正确。
