为了提高中学英语教学水平,我系邀请部分有经验的中学英语教师和我系教师一起编写了这套《高中英语综合技能训练》丛书(共三册),分别供高一、高二、高三使用。第一册由李式燕,张克勤主编,第二册由杨煜明,谢明主编,第三册由于希文,木文典主编。

本丛书根据统编教材和教学大纲,结合高考实际,编写目的有二: 1.提高学生的两个能力,即英语语言能力和应考能力; 2.为高中师生提供丰富、方便的语言训练材料。主要目的是培养语言能力,因为提高语言能力是教学的宗旨,是高考得高分的基础,也是避免高分低能的重要途径。本丛书各册分单项训练和综合测试两大部分,通过大量的单项训练,使学生牢固掌握必要的语言知识和技能,提高阅读,习作,改错,完形填空和语音、语法、拼写的单项选择等能力。在此基础上进行综合测试,培养应考能力。我们认真研究了教学大纲和教材,分析了历年高考试题,选出了常考、必考、难记、易混的知识点和容易得分的题,编入了单元检测题和综合训练题。
