

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前言

作为英语学习的重要技能之一,听力在英语学习中占有十分重要的地位。目前国内流行的各种考试都加大了听力的比重,可见提高听力能力的重要性。从历届高等学校英语应用能力考试(Precto)的听力成绩来看,大学生的听力水平普遍比较低,学生在英语学习的自我评估中,也迫切希望提高听力水平。为了满足广大学生的这一愿望和要求,我们编写了这套听力教材,既可作为教材供学生课堂内使用,也可作为听力强化材料供学生课后自主学习使用。

本册听力教材是根据教育部最新颁发的《大学英语教学大纲》和《高职高专教育英语课程教学基本要求》,结合民办院校学生的特点以及教学对象的英语水平,按以下原则编写的:

- 1. 本书仍然着重听力的基础技能培训。开始阶段仍然以学生熟悉的题材为主,难度逐渐提高,信息量逐渐加大,题材逐渐多样,答题的速度和难度逐渐提高。
- 2. 所选材料注重内容的趣味性、信息性、可思性和前瞻性,同时也注重语言的规范性、实用性。
- 3. 在培养学生听懂基本语言单位(如语音、字母、数字、单词、句型等)的基础上,逐步增强学生在语篇水平上的理解能力和熟练程度,提高他们对所听内容的分析、归纳、综合和推断能力。
- 4. 教材练习的题型丰富多样,其中包括英语应用能力考试模拟 真题(Test yourself),力求从多方面训练和提高学生的听力理解能力。
- 5. 本书增加了相关信息(Related Information)部分,希望学生在 老师的指导下,了解与主题相关的语言内容并可以进行适当的口

头表达能力的基本训练。

本书为民办院校听力教材的第一册用书。本册共十个单元。每个单元均由四个部分组成:第一部分为关键词听力技能训练,第二部分听力任务技能训练,每一个单元围绕着一个中心话题展开,其中同时涵盖了与主题相关的语言信息。第三部分为与真题难度和形式一致的模拟题,便于学生进行自我测试,第四部分是专为提高学生对英语的兴趣安排的幽默小故事或短文。

本套教材由三江学院和金肯职业技术学院联合编写,参加编写的作者大都长期从事民办院校大学英语教学,有着丰富的教学经验和较强的科研能力,因此,在素材的选择、内容难度和练习形式的把握方面具有独到的经验。这也使这套教材更适合民办院校学生的实际水平。

本套教材可作为课本在课堂教学中使用,或作为学生的课外 自学材料,同时本套教材融知识性,趣味性于一体,也为大学校园 广播提供了语言规范、题材广泛、短小精悍的英语广播内容。

在本书的编写过程中,三江学院大外部主任韩立江教授和应 天职业技术学院外语系主任林俊伟教授给予了大力支持,并对全 书提出了许多宝贵的意见,在此一并表示感谢。

全书配有光盘,是由美籍英语专家 Benjamin Archer 先生和 Margaret Howard 女士朗读录音。Part Ⅲ Test Yourself 部分语速等 严格按照考试要求录音。


由于编者水平有限,书中存在的不足之处在所难免,恳请专家、读者不吝赐教。
