[Background]

- 1. Lebanon ['lebənən] (Arabic Lubnan), republic in southwestern Asia, bounded on the north and east by Syria, on the southeast and south by Israel, and on the west by the Mediterranean Sea. The area is 10,400 sq km (4015 sq mi). The capital and leading port is Beirut.
- 2. Beirut (ancient Beyrtus), capital, largest city, and chief seaport of Lebanon, western Lebanon, on the Mediterranean Sea, at the foot of the Lebanon Mountains, near Tripoli. It is linked by railroad and highway to Damascus, Syria, and other major Middle East cities. It also has an international airport.
