五年以前,當我們出版《101 種家族治療技巧》的時候,我沒有想到會引起那麼多的迴響。這本書在各種不同的專業雜誌上,都得到極好的評價,而且這本書在全世界的銷售,也比我們期望的還要好,我們也接到很多治療師的詢問,表示如果會有一本續集的話,他們願意有所貢獻。這本書不只被專業的治療師用來刺激靈感,改進他們的治療,而且也是所有臨床科系的研究所在實習時所用的教科書。讀者寫信來告訴我們「幾乎每一頁都很有創意……」,而且將這本書描述為「令人興奮和充滿活力」和「有很高的可讀性和啟發性」。

不用說,我們對於這些反應感到非常的高興。我們最初的構想, 即從臨床治療師那兒去搜集有趣而且有原創性的技巧,很明顯的是成功了。這本書搜集到的精華,都是從我們參加年會的經驗、和其他治療師的討論,和分享我們個人在臨床上的重大發現而得來的。透過這些所見所聞,我們最初的構想就這樣實現了。

不過,我們也發現,在這個領域裡的人可以提供我們無數的好點子。在我們寫完一本書後沒多久,就有很多人開始詢問第二本書,他們並不知道我們正在著手這個計畫,一直到這本書完成都還有人問。《家族心理治療期刊》(The Journal of Family Psychotherapy)有一個專欄叫做交換技巧,它提供短而且創新的技巧,和那些在《101 種家族治療技巧》一書中的方式滿類似的,有很多非常好的文章,是我們沒有辦法全部出版的。每次我們辦理訓練和工作坊,參加的人就提供很不錯的技巧,我們但願能把它們都放進《101 種家族治療技巧》一書。所以我們只有一件事可以做:那就是編輯第二本書!
