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# 前言

随着工程硕士研究生教育的蓬勃发展,2001年年底国家成立非全日制研究生入学资格考试研究小组,在借鉴国外研究生选拔方式的基础上,提出了改革我国非全日制硕士研究生入学资格考试的新办法。国务院学位办工程硕士入学考试研究小组经过充分的调查研究,提出了两段制考试录取办法,并于2003年开始实施,考试大纲也随之改变。

2004年,国务院学位办对考试大纲进行了修订,发布了《硕士专业学位研究生入学资格考试指南(2004年版)》,适用范围除工程硕士外,还增加了农业推广和兽医专业硕士。硕士专业学位研究生入学资格考试(Graduate Candidate Test,简称GCT)作为国务院学位办新实行的一种考试,考试名称虽然在原来的基础上去掉了"工程"二字,但其考试对象主要还是工程硕士考生。

GCT 试卷由四部分构成:语言表达能力测试、数学基础能力测试、逻辑推理能力测试、外语(语种为英语、俄语、德语和日语)运用能力测试。GCT 试卷满分400分,每部分各占100分。考试时间为3小时,其中每部分为45分钟。

语言表达能力测试主要以语文为工具,测试考生在知识积累基础上的语言表达能力。通过考生对字、词、句、篇的阅读、分辨与理解,考查考生掌握基本的自然科学和人文社会科学知识的水平,特别是运用语言工具对知识进行表达的能力。

数学基础能力测试主要以数学基础知识为背景,重点考查考生的基本数学 素养及对基本数学概念的理解,考查考生逻辑思维能力、数学运算能力、空间想 象能力以及分析、解决问题的能力。

逻辑推理能力测试主要考查考生应用常用的逻辑分析方法,通过对已获取的各种信息和综合知识的理解、分析、综合、判断、归纳等,引出概念,寻求规律,对事物间的关系或事件的走向趋势进行合理的判断与分析,确定解决问题的途径和方法。

外语运用能力测试所涉及的基本内容相当于四年制大学非外语专业毕业生 应达到的水平,通过词汇与语法、阅读理解、完形填空等题型,着重测试考生 运用外语的能力。 GCT 试题均采用客观选择题,含阅读理解、分析判断、正误辨识、情景分析、数理解析、逻辑推理等。答题形式为选择、填空等。试题知识面涵盖哲学、经济学、法学、教育学、文学、历史、理学、工学、农学、医学等。

为了满足广大 GCT 联考考生见识各种英语试题,了解英语测试的重要考核点和解题套路,掌握解题技法,我们根据多年的教学辅导经验,紧密结合最新考试大纲,倾力推出这本《硕士专业学位(GCT)联考英语过关必做 1200 题》。

### 本书具有如下特色:

### 一、根据最新大纲精神,编写难度贴近真题的题型,内容最新

本书以最新考试大纲精神为依据,全面、系统、深入地介绍了各种英语考试题型,并辅之以大量经典的试题及详细解析,全面提升考生的综合应试能力。

### 二、精辟阐明解题思路,全面展现题型特点

许多考生缺乏实际临场经验,本书将精辟阐明解题思路,全面展现题型特点。建议考生不要一开始就先看答案,一定要自己先做,认真地思考,如果不会做,要知道自己哪里还没有弄懂,哪些知识点还没有掌握,然后再看答案与解析,这样才会在自己的记忆里留下较深的印象,下次碰到类似的问题就迎刃而解了。
