说 明

为了适应中学开展英语课外活动的需要,提高学生学习 英语的兴趣,创造学习外语的环境,我们选编了《英语课外 活动》一书,供普通中学师生和业余英语爱好者选用。

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一、单词游戏

Word Games

单词游戏是帮助学生记单词的一种方法,它既能提高学生的学习兴趣,又有助于他们归纳和扩充词汇。下面五种单词游戏,可供个人评比或小组、班级之间竞赛选用。
