getting lost.”

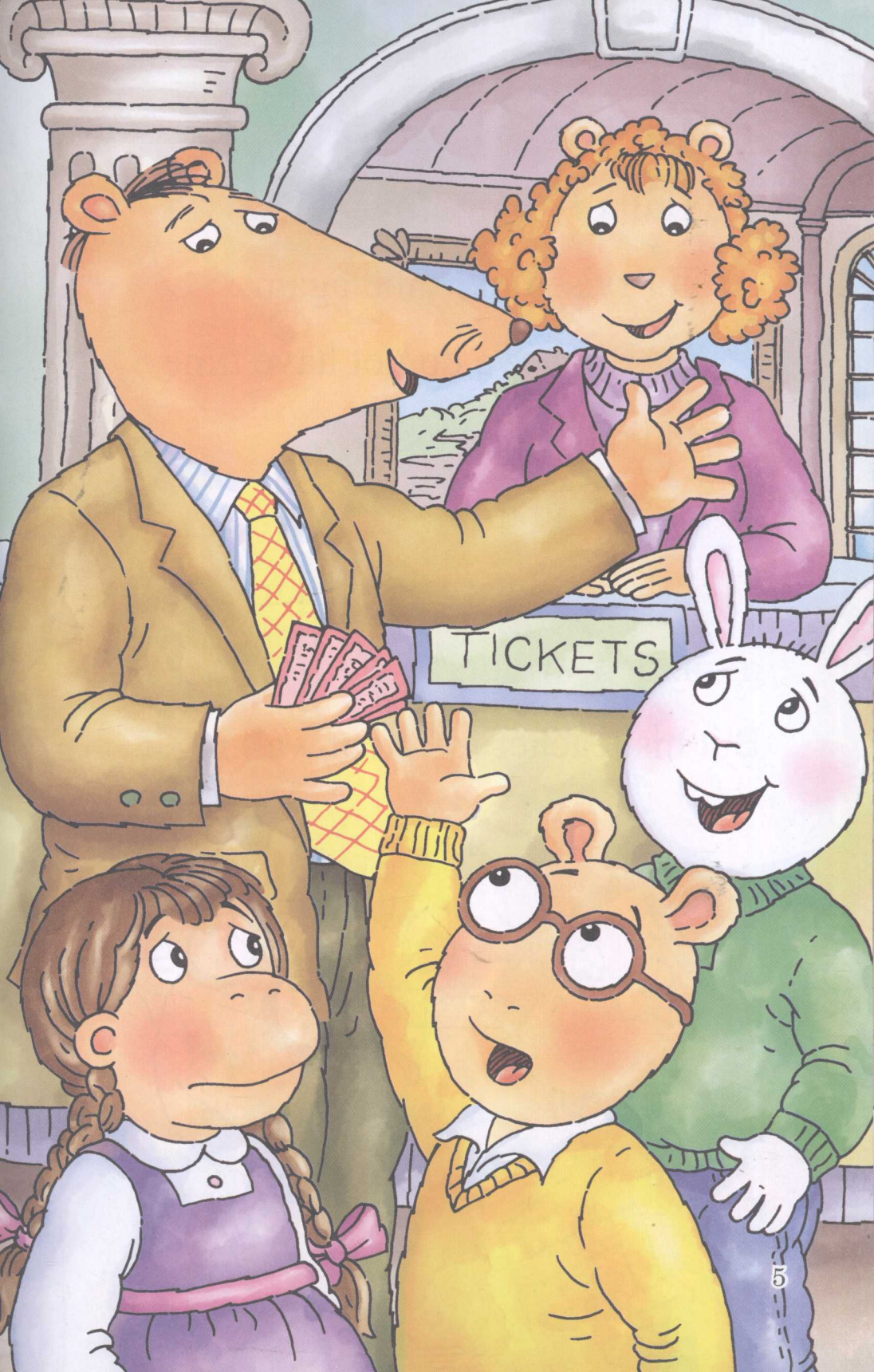
“Today we will visit

the Hall of **Dinosaurs**.

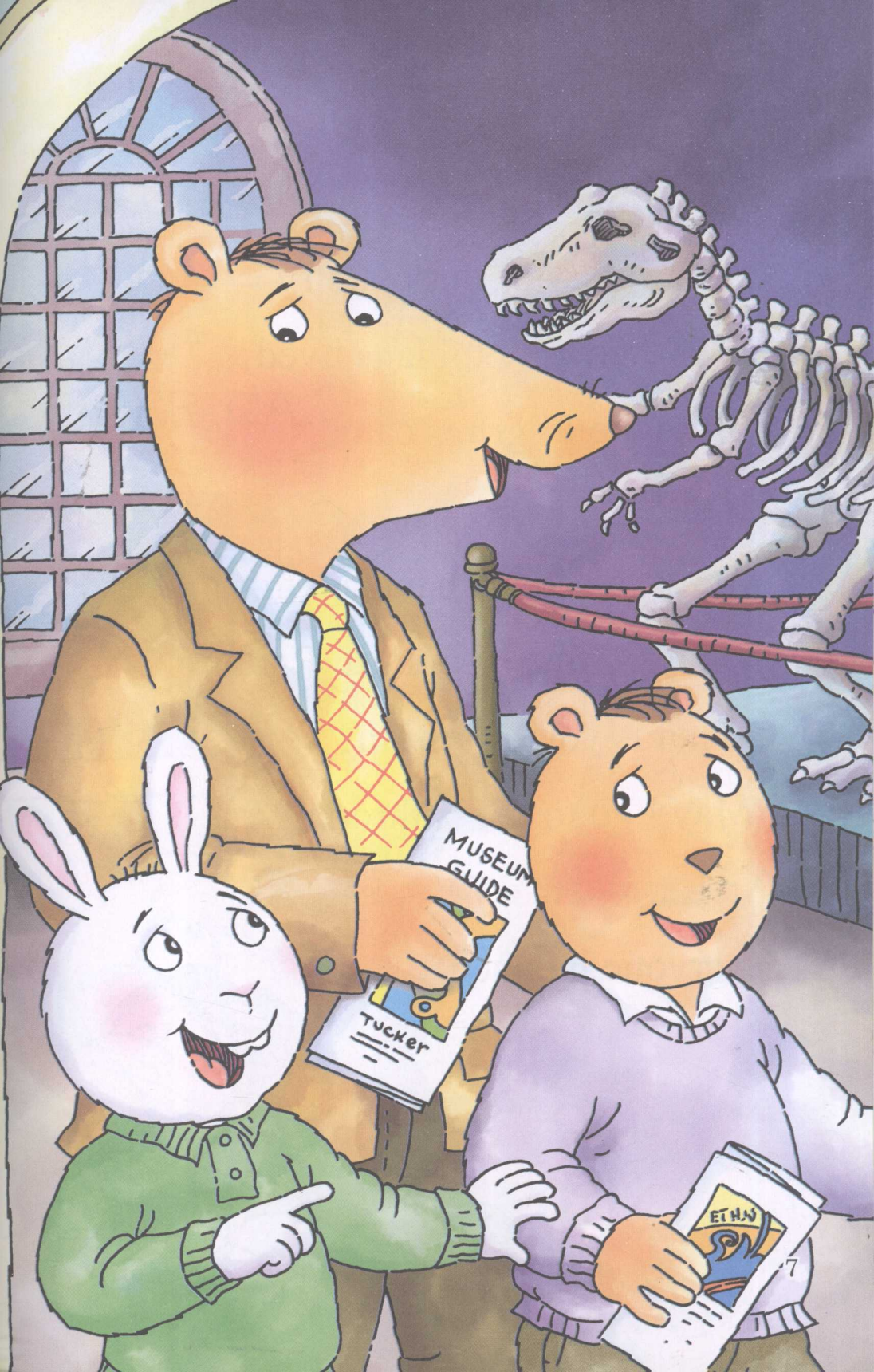
Arthur raised his hand again.

“Okay, Arthur,” said Mr. Ratburn.

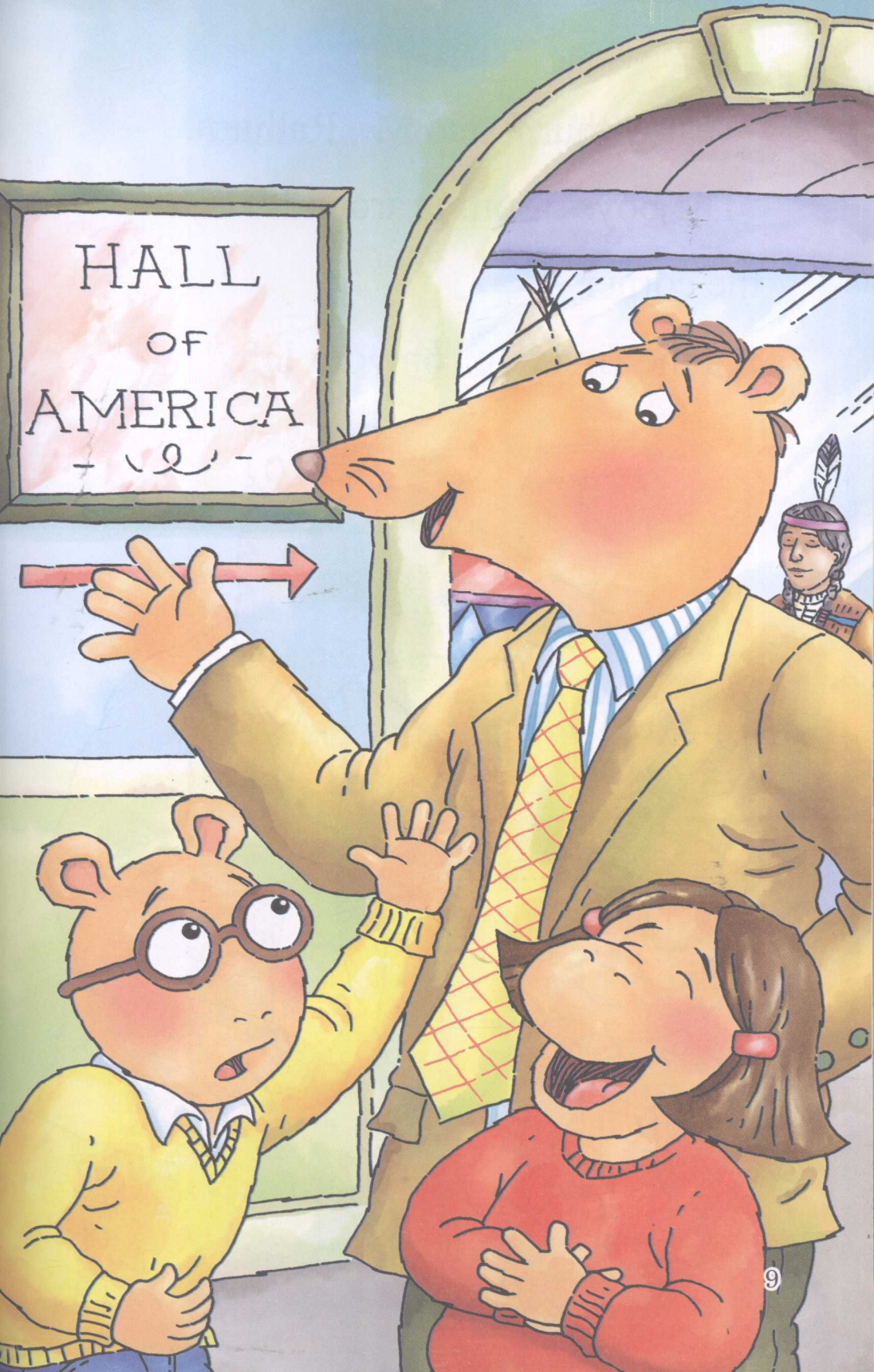
“What is your question?”

Everyone laughed.

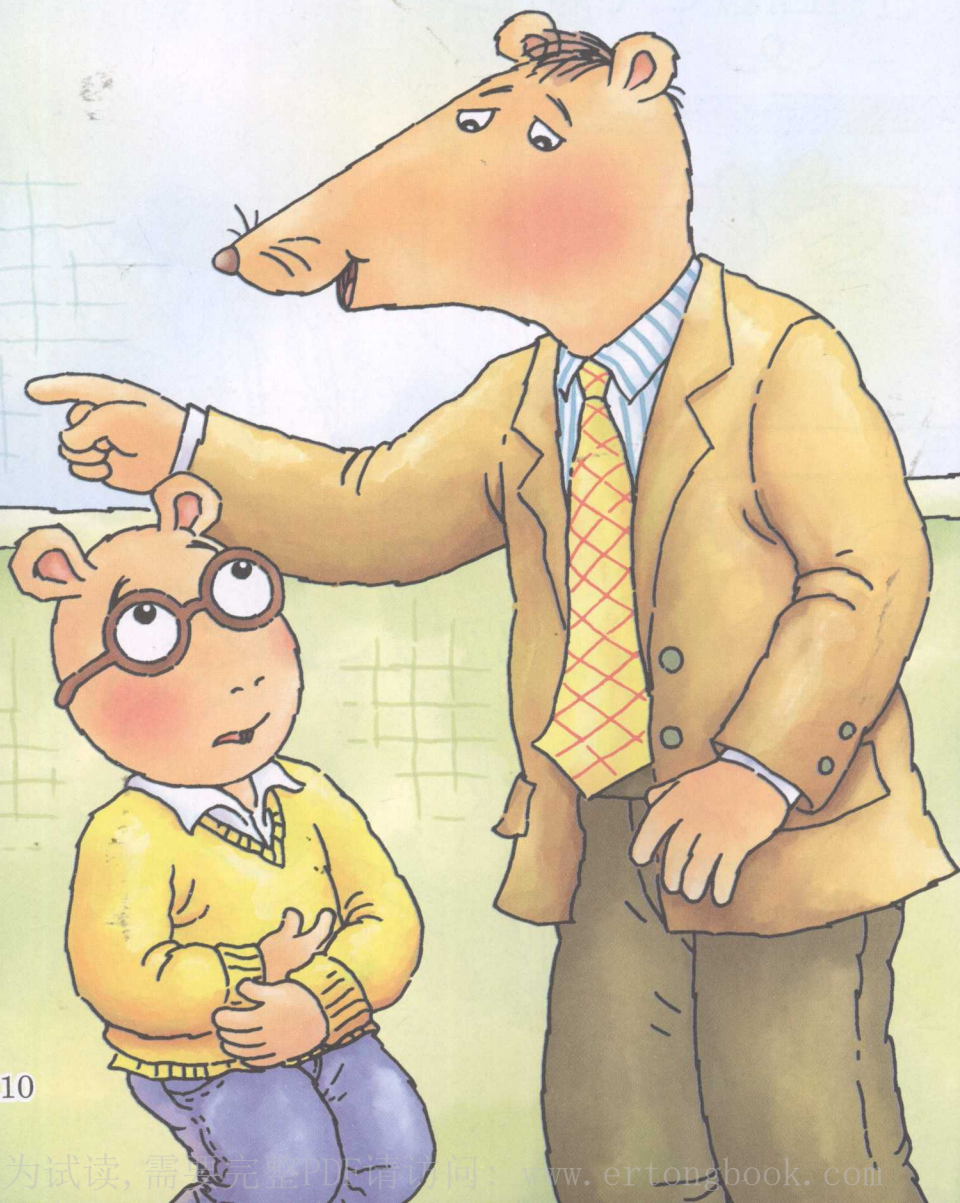




“Yes, Arthur,” said Mr. Ratburn.

the corner.

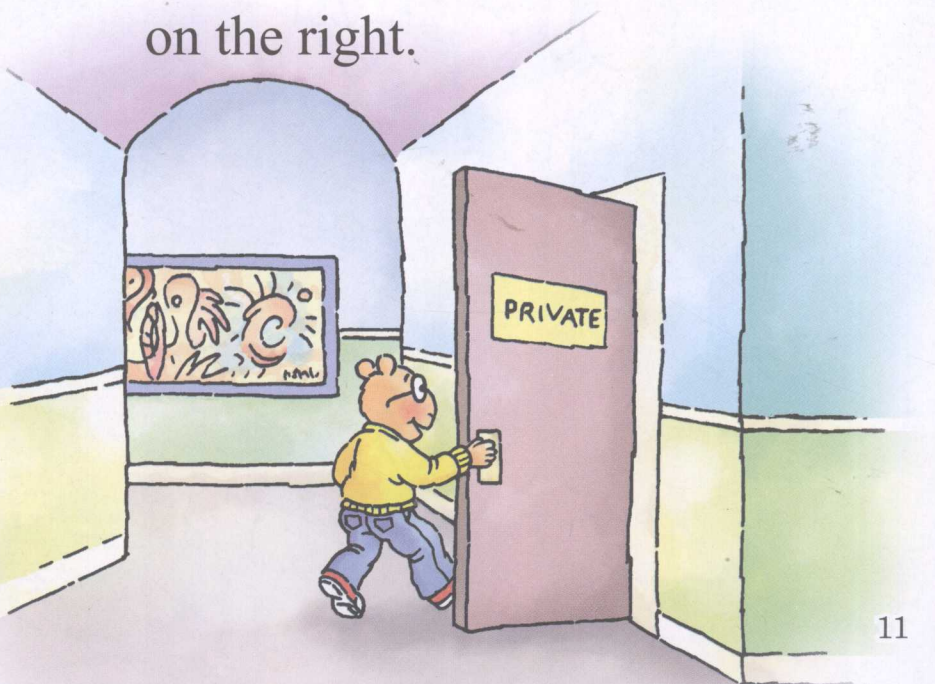
It’s the first **door** on your left.”

They were models.

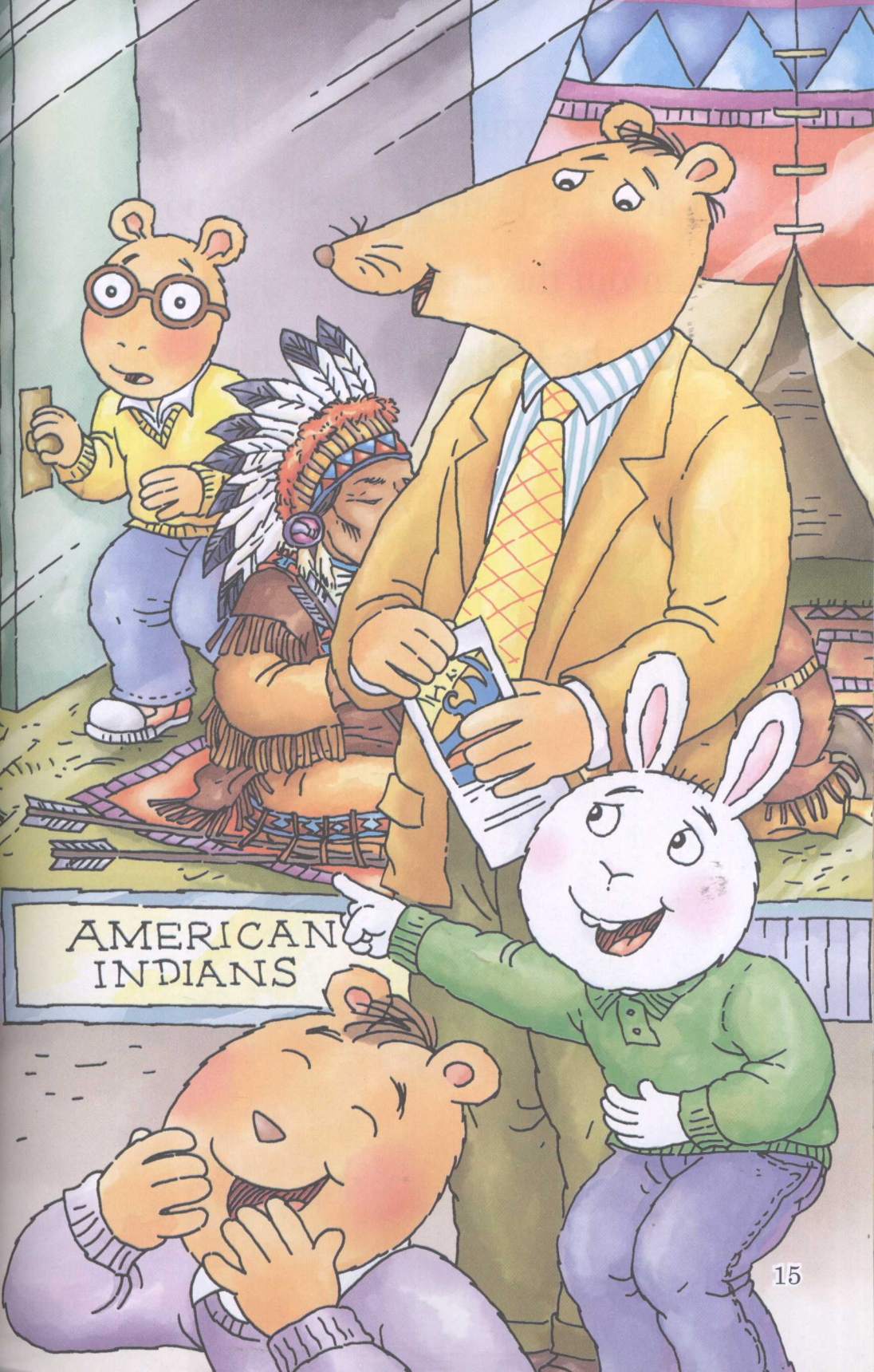
One wall was glass.
