Number eight, open the gate.



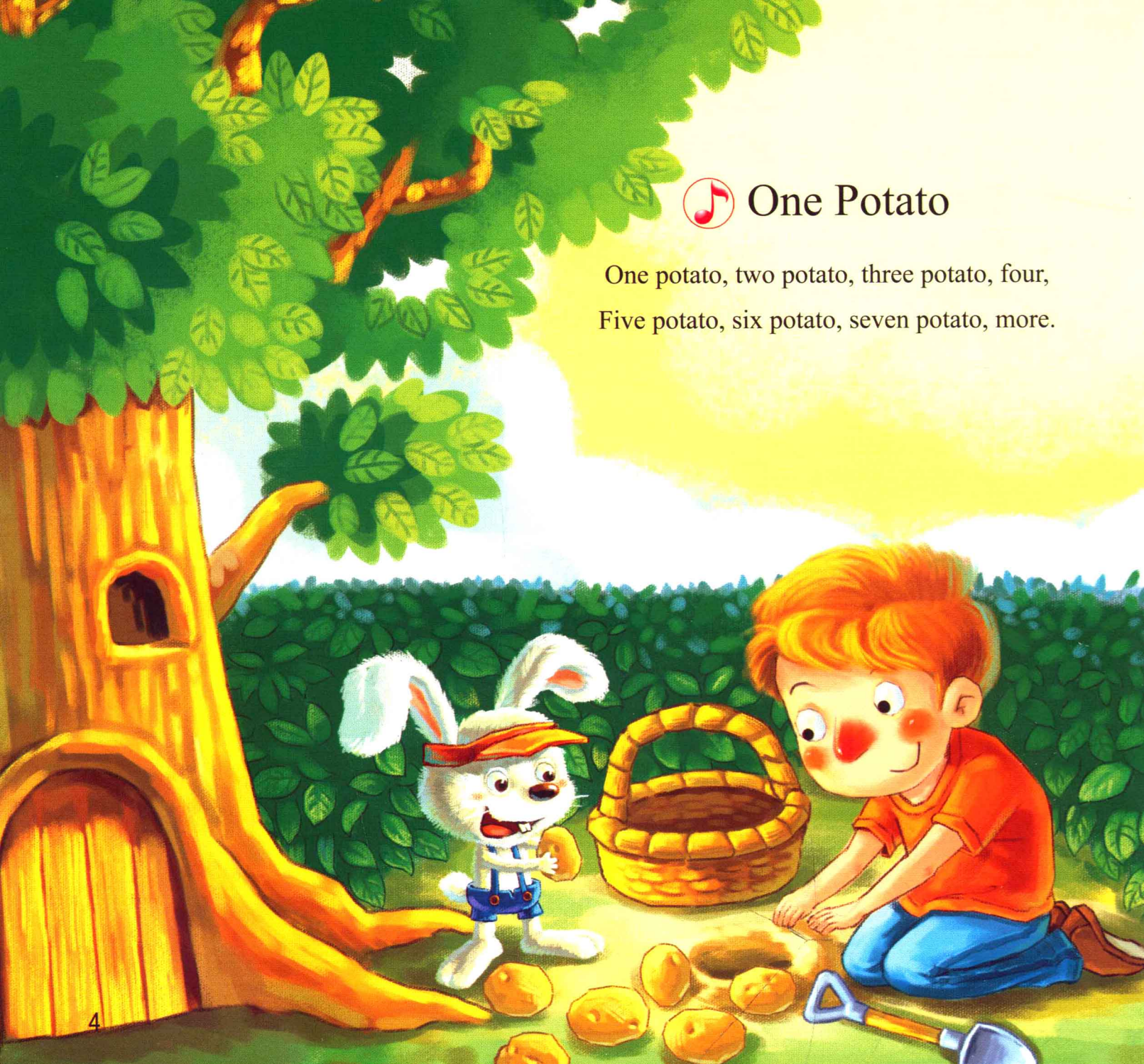
Number nine, touch your spine.

Six, seven, eight, nine, ten,

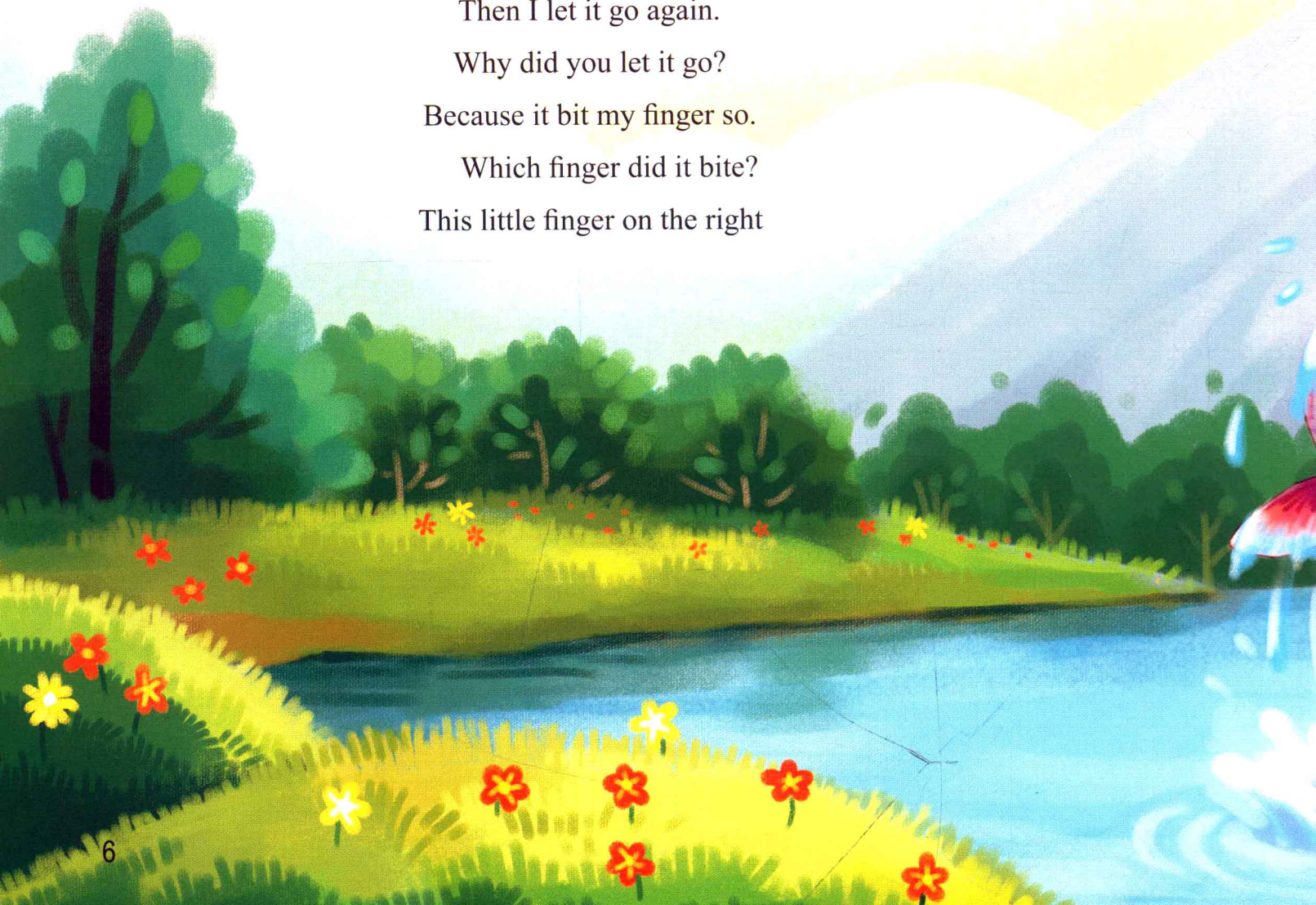
Then I let it go again.

This little finger on the right







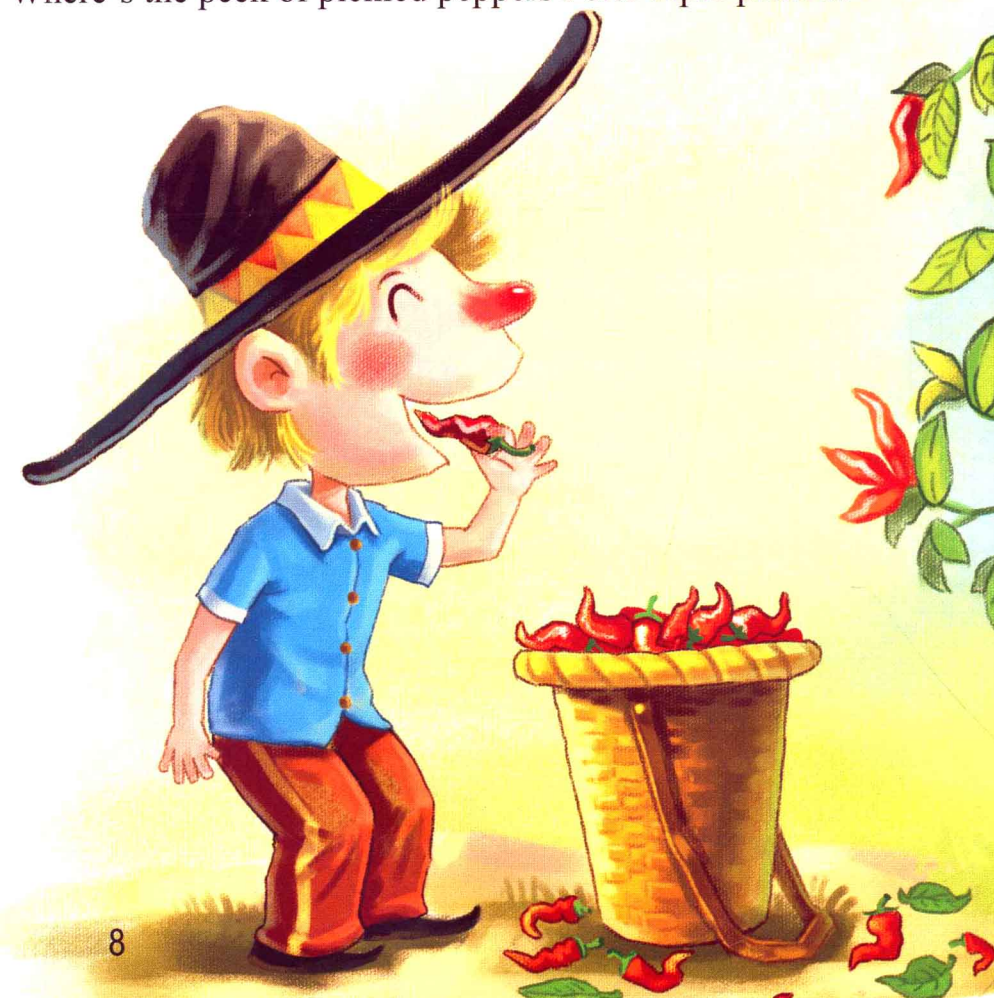
Peter Piper

Poor Cat Fright

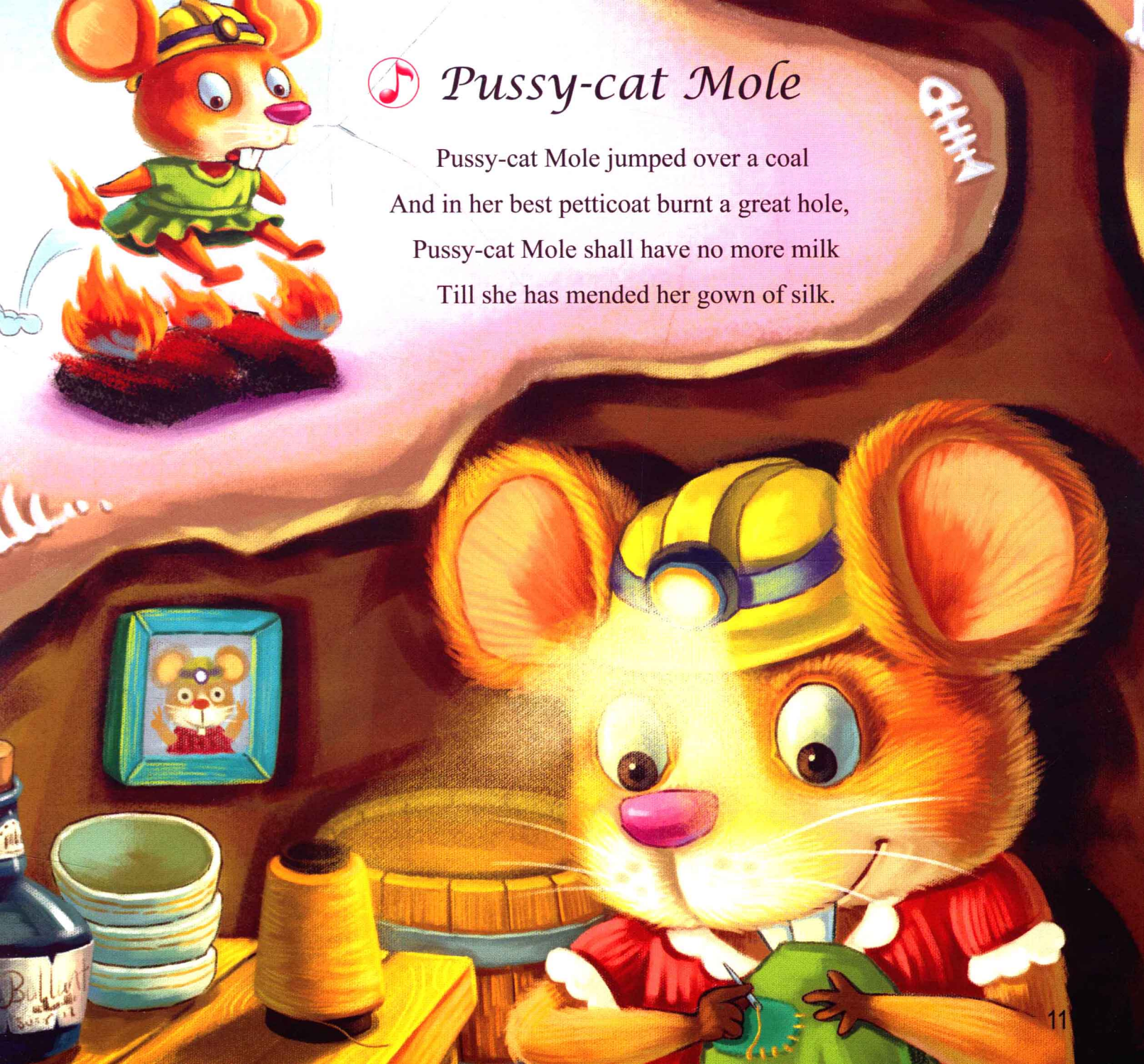
Ran off with all her might,

Till she has mended her gown of silk.





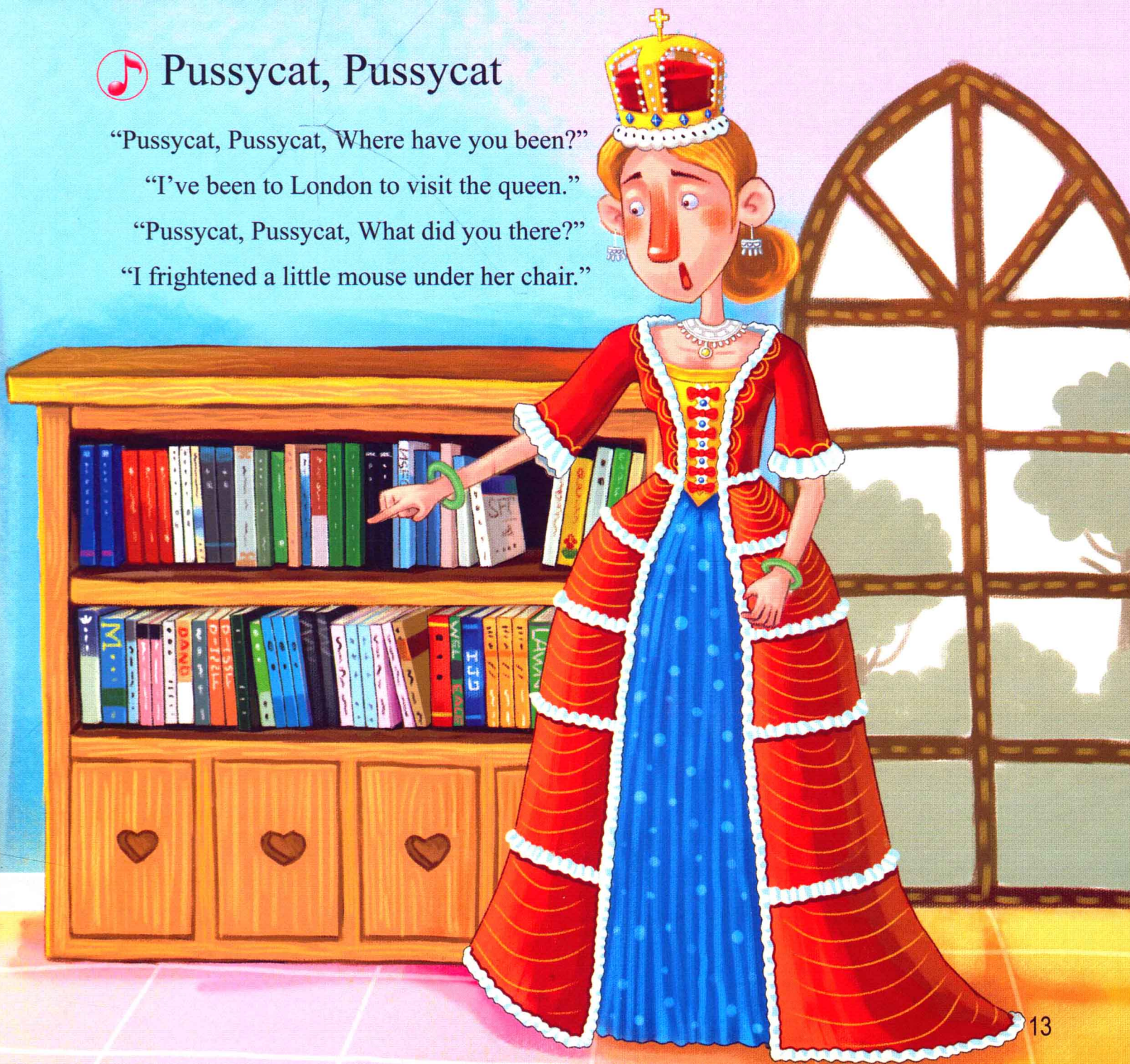
Pussycat, Pussycat
