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内 容 提 要

《英语中级口译资格考试词汇》为《上海外语口译证书培训与考试系列》丛书之一。本书汇集历届考题作为语料库,从中选取高频词语,分为听力、阅读、翻译、口译四部分罗列,每个词条下配以全真题中的例句,同时配以翻译,帮助读者理解例句,强化词汇记忆。读者对象为全国参加英语中级口译的考生以及参加考试培训的考生,同时对有志于提高翻译口译水平的英语爱好者也有相当的帮助作用。

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前 言

由上海市委组织部、市人事局、市教委和市成教委联合主办的“英语中高级口译岗位资格考试”自 1995 年春推出以来,至今已走过十七个春秋。中高级口译资格考试层次高、要求严、实用性强、目的明确,因此考试人数历年递增,至今考生数量已经跨过百万大关。同时,考生已经辐射到中国多个省市地区,北至青岛、烟台,南至南昌、宁波,都有大量考生参加考试。近几年推出的基础口译资格考试也吸引了大批对口译怀有热情的基础考生,考生数量节节攀升。为满足不同水平考生的需要,本套丛书针对各层次口译资格考试的大纲要求,分析研究各类口译考试的所有全真试卷,针对各层次口译考试的核心词汇和语法要点,分别编写《英语基础口译资格考试词汇》、《英语中级口译资格考试词汇》、《英语高级口译资格考试词汇》和《英语中高级口译资格考试语法必备》,帮助考生达到大纲要求。

本册《英语中级口译资格考试词汇》具有以下特点:

1. 分门别类,条理分明

本书对词汇分门别类,分为听力词汇、阅读词汇、翻译词汇和口译词汇四大板块。听力词汇主要汇集了中级口译考试全真题听力部分的关键词语。阅读词汇主要汇集了全真题阅读部分的核心词语。翻译词汇汇集了全真题翻译部分的关键词语。口译词汇汇集了高级口译考试口译部分涉及的关键词语,选取的材料来自高级口译考试口试部分考题以及题材广泛的会议讲话。

2. 例句权威,以题为本

本书词条下的例句来自于 2000 年至 2012 年的所有全真题。听力部分的词条举例来自听力原文,阅读部分的词条例句来自于全真题的所有阅读篇章,翻译词汇的例句都来自于翻译部分。本书例句涵盖的内容包含科技、商业、政治、经济、社会文化等多方面,词条在各类文本中复现率较高。

3. 双语对照,重点突出

本书阅读部分、翻译部分、口译部分词条下的例句都配有对应译文。阅读篇章是英文原文,阅读词条英文例句下配有中文译文。翻译篇章以英译中为重,每个例句下都配有忠实通顺的翻译译文。口译词





条下以中文例句为重,每个例句都配有英文的口译译文。阅读和翻译部分的例句双语对照有助于读者正确地理解文本,口译部分的双语对照有助于读者利用所学重点词汇流畅而恰当地进行口译实践。

语言能力的提高无法在朝夕之间突飞猛进,我们希望考生通过利用本套丛书,进行必要的积累和训练,从而在考场上取得好的成绩。本书为需要参加中级口译资格考试的学生所编写,也可供需要达到与中级口译资格考试相当英语程度的英语学习者使用。

由于时间仓促,加之水平有限,书中难免存在一些问题,敬请读者批评指正。

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听力词汇

本部分主要汇集了中级口译考试听力部分中有助解题的关键词语。中级口译听力部分包含多种题型,包括听写填空、单句理解、对话理解、句子听译、段落听译等,涵盖的内容涉及政治、经济、科技、社会和文化等诸多方面。本部分根据考试要求,例句完全取自听力真题,内容涵盖面广,涉及许多当今社会关注的主要问题,例句内容难度较大,句子听译和段落听译都配以中文译文,有助于读者正确理解和掌握词汇,同时扩展知识面,为提高口译技能打下良好的基础。

在听力部分词汇的学习过程中,建议考生分三步走。首先,考生要学习掌握所列听力词汇,而后,将单词置于例句的上下文中,通过阅读正确理解单词。其次,朗读例句,熟悉单词发音,并且能够在上下文中迅速准确地把握所列单词的含义。最后,熟悉例句,充分了解单词所在的语境和背景知识。基础听力考试中涉及的主要场景有学习生活、工作社会、家庭生活、娱乐休闲、交通、医疗健康等,通过场景考生可以借助联想记忆,记忆更多的相关词汇。经过以上学习,考生一定能在听力部分有较大的提高。

In other words, he can learn a great deal from books, but it is the experience of the situations and the application of this knowledge that will eventually count. (2000/3 *Spot Dictation*)

To be successful, managers of international companies cannot just sit back and wait for things to happen. Rather, they should be active in their approach to challenges and opportunities. (2006/3 *Sentence Translation*)

My teachers encouraged me and said I had a bent for law or the like. I suppose my personal qualities made me choose law, and not art or architecture, for instance. (2002/9 *Talks and Conversations*)

aristocracy /ˈæɪrɪstɒkrəsi/ *n.* 贵族, 贵族阶级

Our nation has been an existence for over 200 years, and lawyers have been this nation's aristocracy since its formation. (2011/9 *Spot Dictation*)

artificial /ˌɑːtrɪfɪʃl/ *adj.* 人造的; 虚伪的

The thought of these highly artificial food constituents taking the place of present day foods may not be very attractive, but they may be the answer to food shortage and severe starvation in some parts of the of world. (2011/9 *Talks and Conversations*)

My grandfather was a farmer with no aspiration for fashions. (2004/9 *Passage Translation*)

M: A boy assaulted a teacher with a knife. Whatever next? You never know.

W: He ought to be given a good beating.

(2004/9 *Talks and Conversations*)

The solution of course is to learn the rules and techniques of successful test taking. Success builds assurance and confidence which in turn frees you to perform better and better. (2011/3 *Talks and Conversations*)

When this target is attained, we shall be glad to discuss with you a long-term agreement on a more cooperative basis. (2005/3 *Statements*)

During the 1960s, fashion shops for young people, also refer to as “boutiques”, were opened all over Britain, and London became the world’s most important fashion center for the young. (2002/3 *Talks and Conversations*)

brand /brænd/ *n.* 烙印, 标记; 商标, 牌子 *vt.* 加污名于; 铭记

M: Here we are talking about ads we’ve seen, aren’t we? We are all influenced by those celebrities and brand names. (2009/3 *Talks and Conversations*)

briefing /ˈbrɪfɪŋ/ *n.* 简要情况, 简介

It was supposed to be a short briefing but it lasted 3 hours. We were all exhausted when we stepped out of the conference room, all except the chairperson. (2005/3 *Sentence Translation*)

Unless the whole production cost could be reduced to a reasonable limit, the company would have to double its budget by next year. (2008/3 *Statements*)

News groups are essentially electronic bulletin boards. (2010/3 *Spot Dictation*)

Due to our vigorous advertising campaign, the sales figure for our new product has reached 360,000 dollars this month, three times of our original promotion plan. (2008/9 *Statements*)

Twice as many tickets for the Auto Show could have been sold, but the exhibition hall has only a capacity for 500 visitors. (2000/9 *Statements*)

Before scientists learned about vitamins and other constituents of food, such as proteins and carbohydrates, people believed in eating large quantities of food and were not concerned so much about a balanced diet. (2011/9 *Talks and Conversations*)

Not long ago, individuals joined an organization and often stayed with it for their entire working career. (2010/3 *Passage Translation*)

W: When will it be ready?

Many more sports are represented, including the very celebrated event, the marathon races. (2008/3 *Spot Dictation*)

ceremony /ˈserəməni/ *n.* 仪式, 礼节, 典礼

At first, the Chairman didn't intend to attend the opening ceremony, but he changed his mind at the last minute. (2001/9 *Statements*)

certificate /səˈtɪfɪkət/ *n.* 执照, 证(明)书

In any case, when you hurry through the last lesson of the language course, you'll have your completion certificate hanging on your wall. (2007/9 *Talks and Conversations*)

chain /tʃeɪn/ *n.* 束缚; 链条, 链; 连锁店 *vt.* 束缚; 用铁链锁住

The hamburger became even more popular in the 1920s when the first chain of fast food restaurants was started. (2009/3 *Spot Dictation*)

characteristic /ˌkærɪktəˈrɪstɪk/ *n.* 特性, 特征, 特点

For animals, color reflects their environments and their characteristics.
(2012/3 *Talks and Conversations*)

choir /kwaɪə/ *n.* 唱诗班, 合唱队

M: We've got comfortable common rooms and bars. We arrange dances and parties. We've got clubs, theater groups, choirs and so on. (2009/3 *Talks and Conversations*)

chore /tʃɔ:/ *n.* 讨厌的工作; 琐事

Many middle-income-group families employ dailies, and dailies are those people who come during the week to do the cleaning and other house chores for a fixed couple of hours, and in turn, they receive an hourly or weekly payment. (2004/9 *Talks and Conversations*)
