#### 内容提要

本书将文理科教材《大学英语》和理工科教材《新英语教程》的精要以四级考试中"词汇与结构"和"完形填空"的形式编纂起来。并配有四个学期的期末考试题(听力部分配有录音),既可帮助读者巩固语言要点,又可训练读者提高篇章能力。使用此书还可收到学习两套教材的效果。

本书适用于大学文理工科本、专科学生和其他准备通过四级考试的读者,可配合两套教材同步使用,亦可在四级考试前作强化练习使用。

H・52 定价: 5.90 元 近年来,全国各高等院校都在为认真贯彻国家教委颁布的新大学英语教学大纲而努力,并已取得了不少成绩。但除重点院校外,多数一般院校的大学英语四级统一考试的成绩,至今尚不很理想。其原因是多方面的;然而,教与学的方式还是其中的关键,诸如各学期平时的基本功训练不够、平时缺乏教学与相应测试的结合,课外及时加强巩固和熟巧训练不足等等,也就是说,在一定程度上忽视了平时教学的同步课外强化练习。因此,只通过四级考试前短期集中的强化训练是不够的,也较难提高运用语言的实际能力。

我觉得,《大学英语同步强化练习精编》可以弥补上述教学方面的不足而有效地促使学习者语言能力和交际能力的提高,进而增强应试能力。这是因为该书从实际出发,强调大学英语学习各阶段的平时同步训练,重视教学与相应测试的紧密结合及基本功强化训练,对翔实材料进行了科学的安排。此外,该书的材料是以国家教委推荐的目前广泛采用的文理科及理工科两套教材为依据精编的,包括文理科及理工科两套教材至不重叠的词汇与结构;因此,不仅有利于学习者扩大词汇而且有益于学习者提高对多种题材文章的阅读能力。

总之,《大学英语同步强化练习精编》具有较强的系统性、针对性与实用性,会在大学英语教学过程中起到助学的积极作用,从而逐步提高学习成绩,促使学习者尽早通过四级考试。为此我愿向广大学习者推荐此书。

目前,我国大学英语教学分别执行《文理科大学英语教学大纲》和《理工科大学英语教学大纲》,课堂教学分别采用文理科教材和理工科教材。然而,学生参加的四、六级全国英语统一考试却是一样的试卷。为了帮助广大同学在学习大学英语时打下扎实的语言基础,并在学习中收到事半功倍的效果,我们仅以《大学英语》(文理科)和《新英语教程》(理工科)两套教材为蓝本,精心编纂了这本《大学英语同步强化练习精编》。

本书集中体现了两套教材由选材不同而造成的词汇和结构方面的特点,并将这些特点以四级考试中"词汇与结构"和"完形填空"的形式编纂起来,使本书的使用者在学习一套教材的同时,又可以学习另一套教材的语言要点,收到一箭双雕的学习效果。本书分四级,每一级与两套教材相应的精读课本一致,分十个单元。各级分别配有一套模拟期末考试试卷,可作为自测题在期末考试前使用,听力部分配有录音,书后有录音文字资料。书中所有题目配有答案。

本书是编者在教学实践中对大量题目进行选择后编纂而成的,是全体编者辛勤劳作的结果。本书适用于使用这两套教材的本科生和专科生,可随课内教学同步使用,亦可在期末考试前或四级考试前复习时使用。

本书在编写过程中得到天津大学出版社高亚洲同志的热情支持;天津市大学外语教学研究会杨兆民先生审阅了全部书稿,并热情作序;天津大学外语系魏旭光先生亦对本书进行了审校并提出修改意见。对此,一并表示衷心地感谢。对所参考文献的作者、出版社亦在此表示谢意。
