为了提高中学英语教学水平,我系邀请部分有经验的中学英语教师和我系教师—起编写了这套《高中英语综合技能训练》丛书(共三册),分别供高一、高二、高三使用。第一册由李式燕,张克勤主编,第二册由杨煜明,谢明主编,第三册由于希文,本文典主编。

本丛书根据统编教材和教学大纲,结合高考实际,编写目的有二: 1.提高学生的两个能力,即英语语言能力和应考能力; 2.为高中师生提供丰富、方便的语言训练材料。主要目的是培养语言能力,因为提高语言能力是教学的宗旨,是高考得高分的基础,也是避免高分低能的重要途径。本丛书各册分单项训练和综合测试两大部分,通过大量的单项训练,使学生牢固掌握必要的语言知识和技能,提高阅读,习作,改错,完形填空和语音、语法、拼写的单项选择等能力。在此基础上进行综合测试,培养应考能力。我们认真研究了教学大纲和教材,分析了历年高考试题,选出了常考、必考、难记、易混的知识点和容易得分的题,编入了单元检测题和综合训练题。

前言

本书为《高中英语综合技能训练》丛书第二册,是根据教学大纲和现行统编教材高中《英语》第二册编写,供高二年级全学年使用。其目的是为师生提供与教材配套使用的综合训练与测试,帮助学生复习、巩固所学的语言知识,培养和提高学生综合运用英语的实际能力。

目前高考趋向于学生综合能力的考查,而师生普遍反映缺乏这方面的整体配套综合训练材料。因此,本书的编写以基础及综合技能训练为主,内容包括完形填空,阅读理解,书面表达,单元及综合测试练习。编排顺序由易到难,循序渐进。所选材料短小精悍,知识面广,趣味性强,难易程度适中,均有较强的可读性。单元练习紧扣大纲,突出了教材所要求的基础与重点内容,对提高学生综合运用所学语言知识的能力很有好处。该书既可按顺序配合教材使用,也可根据不同情况选用。练习中少数地方出现的生词均有汉语注释。

由于编者水平有限,编写时间仓促,本书难免有不足之处,恳请使用本书的师生批评指正。
