编者的话

英语作为信息交流和获取情报的工具之一,已成为各国警察必须学习和掌握的一门知识,而警务英语词汇是警察在执行涉外警务活动中使用得最为基础的英文知识。

随着我国警务工作对外交往地不断深入,人民警察的外语(尤其是作为国际通用语言之一的英语)学习与应用已不容置疑地成为一种必要,也成为衡量人民警察良好的执法能力和执法水平的标志之一。然而,目前我国英语学习材料的销售市场上,以日常英语的学习书籍为主,专门用途的英语词汇书籍也大都以医用、商务、法律等行业的词汇为主。涉及警务英语词汇的书籍主要体现在一些教材上,如刘挺生、严国伟、徐信芳的《现代实用警务英语》(2004);云南警官学院教师王新、田友兰主编的《实用警务英语》(2005),顾俊、谢湘江主编的《警务英语训练教程》(2010)等。由于我国警务工作涉及的范围较广,专业术语较多,目前市场上的英语教材还没有对警务英语词汇进行专门的归类。因此,出版一本包含各类警种专业术语的英语词汇书籍是十分必要的。

本着对警察这一职业的热爱和尊敬,我们编写了《警务英语词汇训练教程》,旨在对各警种的人民警察和即将成为人民警察的学生加强警务英语词汇的积累、学习和应用,使他们成为技术过硬、素质优良、与国际接轨的优秀人民警察。本书收录了与中国警察行业相关联的一部分警务英语词汇,每个章节都附有主题介绍和词汇

练习,以降低学习难度和提高学习者的应用能力。同时,本书还附有四个附录,以便更加规范地学习警衔、警务机构、警务装备和常用罪名方面的英语知识。同时,该教程可作为警察院校提升学生警务英语词汇水平之用,也给从事外警培训的教师们提供相关参考。

全教程共十三个章节,分别是:警察管理、交通管理与安全、 治安管理、消防管理、边境管理、经济犯罪侦查、犯罪调查、海关 管理、社区警务、网络安全、禁毒执法、艾滋病预防和反恐。每一 章都分为四个部分,分别是:热身测试、词汇突破、成果测试和练 习参考答案。

本教程的编写从开始构思到最后定稿都得到了云南警官学院领导和教师们的关心和指导,特别感谢国际警察教育培训学院给予编者们极大的鼓励和支持,感谢外籍专家 Colin MacIntyre, Fred 对该书的英文部分做了精心的润饰。

由于编者水平有限,书中难免出现错误和疏漏,恳请专家和读者谅解并提出宝贵意见,以便我们进一步修改和完善。

Chapter 1 Police Management 警察管理

The people's police of China consists of policemen working in public security organs, state security organs, prisons and organs in charge of reeducation through labor, as well as judicial policemen working in the People's courts and the People's procuratorates. Tasks of the police are to safeguard state security, maintain public order, protect citizens' personal safety and freedom and their legal property, protect public property, and prevent, stop and punish illegal and criminal activities. At the same time, police must uphold the Constitution and laws as the guiding principle for their activities. In performing their duties, they must conscientiously subject themselves to the supervision of society and its citizens. Citizens and organizations shall give them support and assistance.

Police management refers to organizing of the people's police in a certain way. According to its nature, tasks and characteristics, the work of the people's police are compiled, allocated and administered. Management tasks include: recruitment, training, examination, appointment, investiture, promotion, award, punishment, dismissal

and discharge. In order to strengthen the police contingent and improve the quality of police management, police must be, as prescribed by the State, be recruited according to qualifications of those who have passed a public examination and a strict verification.

In recent years, the Chinese government has promoted education for the people's police and carried out in a planned way among the police education and training in political ideology, the legal system and police work. Individuals or groups who have achieved outstanding successes or made significant contributions in work shall be awarded. Awards include: Citation for Meritorious Deeds, Merit Citation Class III, Merit Citation Class II, Merit Citation Class II, and A Title of Honor. Any police who violates discipline shall be given an administrative sanction. Sanctions include: a disciplinary warning, a demerit recorded, a grave demerit recorded, demotion, dismissal from the post and discharge from public employment. If a crime is committed, he shall be investigated for criminal responsibility according to the law.
