

内容提要

本教材是根据教育部 2017 年最新颁发的《大学英语教学指南》和最新大学英语四级统 考题型,并结合大学英语基础目标的教学特点以及教学对象的英语水平,按以下原则修订 编写:

- 1. 着重英语听力的基础技能训练。开始阶段仍然以学生熟悉的新闻英语题材听写跟读入手,信息量逐渐加大,题材逐渐多样,难度逐渐提高。
- 2. 所选材料注重内容的趣味性、信息性、时效性,同时也注重语言的规范性、实用性。 听力材料大多选自历年四级真题和最新新闻材料。
- 3. 在培养学生听懂基本语言单位(如语音、字母、数字、单词、句型等)的基础上,逐步增强学生在语篇水平上的理解能力和熟练程度,提高他们对所听内容的分析、归纳、综合和推断能力。
- 4. 教材练习的题型丰富多样,其中包括全国四级考试的新题型,力求从多方面训练和提高学生的听力理解能力。

本册共八个单元。每个单元均由三个部分组成:第一部分为单项新闻英语听力技能训练,每一个单元围绕着一个中心话题展开。第二部分为长对话和短文听力技能训练,其中包括单词和短语(words and phrases)、基本句型(basic structures)和常用语句(useful expressions)。第三部分为单元自我测试,安排一套四级听力全真模拟试题检验学习效果。全书最后精选两套最新英语四级统试听力真题,并配有答案和听力原文。

本书由三江学院长期从事大学英语教学的一线教师编写,李璐璐、宋丹红、肖声扬、张苏吉、赵祎婷在资料收集、真题考点解析、音频复核等方面做了大量的工作,在素材的选择、内容难度和练习形式的把握方面具有独到的经验,也更贴近在校大学生的实际水平。

在本书的编写过程中,三江学院外国语学院院长郑玉琪教授给予了大力支持,并对全书提出了许多宝贵的意见,在此一并表示感谢。

全书由美籍专家录音,音频文件可扫码在线听,也可通过网址下载。

由于编者水平有限,书中存在的不足之处在所难免,恳请专家、读者不吝赐教。
