为了帮助广大考生在较短的时间内系统备考,顺利通过考试,我们为广大考生量身订制了这本《全国医学博士英语统考综合应试教程》。修订版增加了 2017 年真题,以便考生掌握考试最新动向,2017 年的部分真题将放置于随书赠送的网络课堂中,供考生下载练习。

全书共分五章:

第一章为听力理解,通过真题讲解听力理解部分的测试特点、应试技巧与方法以及听力常考用语,并配有专项练习和解析;修订版的听力部分将最新真题按照考试不同题型重新编排,解析部分更是精心制作,不仅含有听力原文和题目、选项对应的中文,还针对不同题型的解题技巧做出详细讲解,真正做到讲练结合,旨在帮助考生有效地运用应试技巧,具有极强的指导性。

第二章为词汇,通过真题演练讲解词汇部分测试内容和应试方法,并详细介绍了几种词汇记忆方法和重点的词根和词缀;结合例句对常考词组进行讲解,并配有专项练习和详细解析;此外,修订版将近三年真题作为词汇测试部分中的真题演练,并根据不同题型重新编排,这样,考生在掌握了必要的解题技巧后,能够最直接地将不同的解题技巧运用到相应的真题中,可大大增加考生的应试能力。

# (一) 考试大纲要求及试卷结构

根据《全国医学博士外语统一考试英语考试大纲》(以下简称《考试大纲》)的有关规 定, 试卷中的听力部分包括两个模块: Section A和 Section B。答题时间共约 30 分钟, 听力部分共计30分。

Section A 为简短对话, 旨在测试考生的英语听力能力。考试过程中, 考生会听到每个 简短对话和之后的提问,对话及问题只读一遍。然后,考生有 12 秒的作答时间,根据所 听题目和对话,从四个选项中选出最佳答案。此部分共15个小题,每题1分,共计15分。

# Passage One

Across the industrialized world, women still live 5 to 10 years longer than men. Among people over 100 years old, 85% are women, according to Tom Perls, founder of the New England Centenarian Study at Boston University and creator of the website LivingTo100.com. Time.com asks him why.

Why do women live longer than men?

One important reason is the big delay — and advantage — women have over men in terms of cardiovascular disease, like heart attack and stroke. Women develop these problems usually in their 70s and 80s, about 10 years later than men. For a long time, doctors thought the difference was due to estrogen. But studies have shown that this may not be the case, and now we know that giving estrogen to women post-menopause can actually be bad for them.

One reason for that delay in onset of cardiovascular disease could be that women are relatively iron-deficient compared to men — especially younger women, those in their late teens and early 20s — because of menstruation. Iron plays a very important part in the reactions in our cells that produce damaging free radicals, which glom onto cell membranes and DNA, and may translate into aging the cell. In fact, in our diets, red meat is the main source of iron, and lack of iron is probably one major reason that being vegetarian is healthy for you. There was a very good study looking at the intake of red meat and heart disease in Leiden in the Netherlands: in regions where people didn't eat red meat, those populations had half the rate of heart attack and stroke compared to the populations that did eat red meat.

# Passage Two

Twenty years ago, Jeff Harris hardly seemed on the road to wealth. He was a college dropout who struggled to support his wife, DeAnn, and three kids, working as a grocery store clerk and at a junkyard where he melted scrap metal alongside convicts. "At times we were so broke that we washed our clothes in the bathtub because we couldn't afford the laundromat." Now he's a 49-year-old investment advisor and multimillionaire in York, South Carolina.

There was one big reason Jeff pulled ahead of the pack: He always knew he'd be rich. The reality is that 80 percent of Americans worth at least \$5 million grew up in middle-class or lesser households, just like Jeff.

"Wanting to be wealthy is a crucial first step," says Harv Eker, author of Secrets of the Millionaire Mind. "The biggest obstacle to wealth is fear. People are afraid to think big, but if you think small, you'll only achieve small things."

It all started for Jeff when he met a stockbroker at a Christmas party. "Talking to him, it felt like discovering fire," he says. "I started reading books about investing during my breaks at the grocery store, and I began putting \$25 a month in a mutual fund." Next he taught a class at a local community college on investing. His students became his first clients, which led to his investment practice. "There were lots of struggles," says Jeff, "but what got me through was believing with all my heart that I would succeed."

# (二) 听力理解考试特点

通过对历年考题的分析,可以看出听力理解考试有以下特点:

# 1. 听力材料内容兼顾日常交际与医学背景

在 Section A 里,多数题目围绕日常对话展开,大约 5~6 个题目涉及医学领域,如去医院看病;有时对话材料里也会提到医学常用词汇,如常见病或症状。因而,考生应该储备一定量的医学常用词汇,但医学词汇不作为听力测试第一部分的主要考点。在 Section B 中,医学为听力材料的主要背景,涉及常见病症、医学常识等。

# 2. 题型较为常见且为客观选择题

无论是第一部分还是第二部分,所有题目均为选择题,这样的题型是考生较为熟悉的形式。而且考试测试点与其他重大英语考试类似: Section A 的题目以测试习惯用语、特殊句式、词组含义、细节与推断题为主,详细的分析将在本章后面阐述; Section B 主要以测试细节为主。因而,从题型上看,考生不会有完全不适应的地方。

# 3. 口音较为固定、语速较快

对于考生来说,听力测试部分较为不适应的地方应该是听力材料的口音以及语速。每个考生可能对某一种英语口音较为熟悉,如英音或美音。医学博士英语统考听力测试中的发音常为标准的英音,因而,考生在平时应该多接触英音,这样才不至于在考试时觉得很陌生。另外,医学博士英语统考听力测试的语速也较快,连读处更是难点。因而,考生在平时听力训练时,应多加强发音规则和规律训练,以适应考试的语速和口音,这样在正式考试时,心理上就会占一定优势。

# 二、考查内容及相应的应试技巧

综观听力部分各类考题, 考生要重视以下方面的问题:

# 1. 知识储备很必要

听力中经常会出现句式、词组、习语等,而这些表达往往是解题的关键,因而,考生 应在考前注重积累与听力考试相关的语言知识点。

# 2. 语境信息是关键

无论是 Section A 还是 Section B,听力题目均在一定的语言环境下提出,无论听力材料的长或短,都会给考生以足够的语言信息,因而抓住了关键信息或信号词(Cue Words)就等于找到了解题的密钥。

# 3. 预读选项有帮助

当听力录音中在播放 Directions 或者例子的时候,考生可利用这段时间预读选项。有些题目选项很有特点,考生通过预读选项可以提前知道考点,或者可以通过突出某个选项关键词对选项进行分类,或者还能够提前知道听力对话或短文的话语情景。所以,考生要养成提前看选项的习惯,做到料敌在先。

# 4. 简单笔记是依靠

在听力考试过程中,由于极度紧张,人的记忆力在那时是有限的。考生经常会有这样的尴尬:在听对话或短文时,信息在脑海里清晰呈现,但是当问题提出后,即将解题时,却怎么也想不起来自己刚才所听到的信息了,结果无法正确解题,同时,紧张情绪增加,十分不利于考试。所以,考生在平时听力训练的时候,就应养成记笔记的习惯,边听边记是训练听力的好办法。

下面将针对听力理解考试的不同部分,结合部分真题,对考点和应试技巧进行有针对性的讲解。

# (一) Section A 的主要考点及应试技巧

听力测试这一部分的考点大致有以下几个方面:细节题、特殊句式、固定词组、常用 习语和推断题。下面就这些考点和应试技巧一一阐述。

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
