《托福边词边题》是历经6年时间编著而成的一本托福词汇书。本书主要有以下三大特点:

- (一)单词全面。词纲是词汇书的躯壳。本书词纲以初中毕业生的词汇量水平为起点,全面覆盖托福单词。备考学生只需具备初中词汇基础即可学习并达到理想水平。
- (二)词义精准。词义是词汇书的灵魂。本书给出的单词释义都是以往考试中考查过的词义,而不是单纯地罗列出单词的所有词义。托福考试的宗旨是测试考生在真实的校园生活和学术环境中的交流能力,因此考生不能只满足于掌握日常用语。本书结合真题语境给出词义,可以很好地帮助考生有针对性地背诵单词。
 - ●针对一词多义。例如,stroke 有许多词义,在日常生活中一般翻译为"中风",而在以往托福考试中并未考查该意思,考查的是"笔触,笔画"和"冲程"这两个意思。一词多义的情况并不少见,考生在有限的备考时间内应该优先背诵本书给出的词义。
 - ●针对熟词僻义。例如,在以往考试中,不仅考过 solid 一词"固态的,固体"的意思,还考过"可靠的,真实有用的"意思。minute 不仅考过"分钟"这个意思,还考过"微小的,极小的"意思。掌握熟词僻义有助于我们提高英语水平。
 - ●针对难解释义。Renaissance (文艺复兴)、niche (壁龛) 这类在中文语境中都有一定理解难度的单词, 在托福考试中经常出现。
- (三)单元与套题——对应。本书各单元的编排完全匹配市面已有的托福考试真题套题的排列顺序,甚至精确到每一篇阅读文章,每一个听力段落。学生可以边背单词边做真题,从而学以致用,增强记忆效果。此外,本书单词的排列也尽可能符合行文顺序,每个单词都是按其在 TPO 1~48 中第一次出现的位置所放置的。所以 TPO 1 中的单词相对比较多,TPO 48 中的单词相对比较少。TPO 1~10 的单词量就占了本书一半的篇幅。

TPO 35~39 未收录于本书之中,因为笔者认为其可信度不高,题目质量与其他套题相差较大。书中难免有错误疏漏之处,诚恳地期望读者们发邮件到 biancibianti@163.com 批评指正。 致谢:

学习计划与使用说明

学习本书的过程可分为三个阶段:

● 基础阶段: TPO 1~10


● 拔高阶段: TPO 11~30

• 冲刺阶段: TPO 31~48

具体的时间安排如下:

- 1. 周一到周五,每天背诵新单词并复习前一天的单词。例如:周一复习上周五背诵的单词,周二复习周一背诵的单词,以此类推。
 - 2. 周末两天复习本周背诵过的所有单词。
 - 3. 月末第四周复习前三周学习的单词。

这样可以保证每个单词当天背一遍,做题用一遍;第二天、周末、月末各复习一遍,保证达到每个单词在一个月内背诵一遍复习四遍的频率,这样基本符合记忆曲线,记忆效果更佳。考生需根据自己的情况确定每天的学习时长。
