



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编写说明

时代的发展、国力的强盛,使我国在国际交往与世界经济领域日益活跃,英语的基本能力、信息意识与信息处理的能力已经成为当代公民的必备素质,英语作为一种国际通用语言愈显重要。中学英语教学的基本模式也随之发生了重大变化,从传统的"重语法和知识传授"向"重应用能力培养"转化;新课程标准对听、说、读、写语言技能提出了综合应用的要求。为此,英语教学必须把语言知识落实到听、说、读、写的实践上,以促进综合语言能力的提高。

听力是语言输入的主要渠道,听力能力的培养与提高必须通过尽可能大的有声语言的输入量,培养接受、理解和处理信息的能力。根据新课程标准的教学目标与教学要求,配合最新版人教社高中课本的教学,以相对应篇目的话题为线索,新编写的《高中英语听力强化训练》,在选材上力求新活,尽量贴近学生日常生活和学习,贴近时代,并贴近学生的实际英语水平。

仅靠语言输入是掌握不了外语的,还需要通过大量的口头和笔头表达,来促进语言的吸收和加工能力的培养,并进一步提高语言的综合应用能力。为此,本书在"协奏曲"部分增加了说的要求,即"Follow up""Topic discussion"部分,供基础较好的学生与学校选择使用,也作为听力类辅助读物的尝试,从语言输入向语言输出延伸。

全套书共分5册,分别供高一至高三各年级师生使用。它的基本特点如下:

- 1. 以单元为单位设置内容、难易程度与人教版现行教材同步,便于使用。
- 2. 每单元分为四个部分。序曲:热身运动篇;二重奏:对话练习篇;协奏曲:短文练习篇;交响曲:欣赏提高篇。选材新颖广泛、容量充足,练习设计层次分明、活泼多样,多角度、多方位地培养学生"听"的能力,体现了素质教育的要求。
 - 3. 本书配套的录音带由外籍专家录制。
