前 言

大学英语四、六级考试(College English Test)作为检验全国大学英语教学的 一把尺子,已经经历了近20个春秋,在大学英语教学与改革方面起到了重要的 推动作用。自20世纪80年代末期大学英语教学大纲实施之日起,语言运用能 力始终就是大学英语教学工作的中心,也是广大大学英语教学工作者与学习者 追求的目标,当然也是大学英语四、六级考试试图检测的重点。 围绕语言运用能 力这个中心,大学英语四、六级考试在实施过程中经历了一些重大改革,主要体 现在强调应用能力,增加主观题类型以及题量上。后来四、六级考试里出现的 Compound Dictation, Short Answer Questions, Error Correction 和 Translation 都是 考试改革的结果。本世纪以来,随着社会对外语人才要求的提高,大学英语界掀 起了新一轮教学改革的热潮。自2004年起,《大学英语课程教学要求(试行)》、 《全国大学英语四、六级考试改革方案(试行)》相继颁布,四、六级考试记分制度 改革,2005 年 10 月《大学英语四级考试(CET-4)试点考试样卷》公布,2006 年 6月在全国部分高校中实施了大学英语四级考试新题型试点考试。2007年四级 新题型将在全国普遍使用。在这种新的形势下,我们组织经验丰富的大学英语 教师对新的题型进行了仔细研究,并根据自己的理解编写了本书,希望通过本书 帮助读者了解大学英语四、六级考试新题型的特点,以利于读者熟悉题型,加强 练习,提高能力。

新题型首先提高了听力的比重,由原来的20%提高到了35%。除了传统的短对话和短文之外,还增加了长对话和复合式听写。体现了新的"课程要求"对听力、口语能力的要求。

阅读的比重由40%减少到了35%,考试题型分为仔细阅读、快速阅读和选词填空。这种考试形式增加了对考生语言应用能力的考查。

综合部分的难度增加了。本部分占15%,但形式多样,包括完型填空、改错、汉译英、简短回答问题等,主、客观题均有。

写作部分仍然占 15%,从要求上看没有什么变化,但也有强调应用的趋势。 从考试的实施来看,对考试各部分的时间要求更严了,如做试卷二时,试卷一不 得启封。从考试各题项顺序安排也能看出这一点,首先是写作,写作完成后是快



速阅读,然后是听力。这种安排将写作和快速阅读的时间进行了严格限定。最 后后是仔细阅读和综合测试部分。

本书共有18套模拟试题。每套试题均按照新的考试大纲要求编写,在题目形式上根据编者的经验以及该题型的特点作了适当的调整。例如快速阅读部分,除了长文章外,我们也根据阅读 skimming 和 scanning 的特点,编写了一部分与应用密切相关的短文章,更适宜于读者做 skimming 和 scanning 方面的训练。综合部分亦如此。总之,应用能力是新题型考试的中心思想,而本书的题型设计希望既体现考试大纲的要求,也能体现这一中心思想。

每套题都配有答案详解,以及听力原文,供读者参考。本书听力部分配有 MP3 光盘一张,由外籍教师按照考试要求录制。在本书的编写过程中,我们得 到了武汉大学出版社王春阁老师的大力支持与帮助,在此表示衷心感谢。由于 时间仓促,书中疏漏在所难免,敬请广大读者不吝指正。

Passage One

Questions 46 to 50 are based on the following passage.

One of the largest counties in Texas, Deaf Smith County, is named for Captain Erastus "Deaf" Smith, a deaf man. Captain Smith was the leader of General Sam Houston's scouts during the Texas Revolution, the war in which Texas won its freedom from Mexico.

Smith married a Mexican woman. He spent a lot of time learning the customs, manners, and language of the Mexican settlers. When the Texas Revolution began in 1835, Smith initially refused to take part in it out of respect for his family's heritage. However, after Mexican troops tried to stop him from going to San Antonio to visit his family, he volunteered for service with the Texans. He was made a captain.

The first major battle of the Texas Revolution occurred in February, 1836, at an old fort called the Alamo. Nearly 6,000 Mexican soldiers fought against only 187 Texans. The Texans managed to defend the fort for twelve days, but in the end, all 187 Texans were killed in the battle.

General Houston was very upset by the fall of the Alamo to Mexican General Santa Anna. He sent Captain Smith to get more details. Smith returned bringing with him Mrs. Almeron Dickerson and her 15-month-old baby. Mrs. Dickerson had been the only American woman at the Alamo.

It was the Battle of San Jacinto on April 21, 1836, that made sure Texas would be free from Mexico.

During the Battle of San Jacinto, Smith rode back and forth across the field behind the Texans waving his axe to let them know that the bridge was destroyed. He called to the fighters: "The bridge is down! They can't get away! Victory or death!"

Erastus Smith was 49 years old at the time of the Battle of San Jacinto. He died about a year and a half later, on November 30, 1837, at the age of 50.
