

前 言

我国旅游业发展迅猛,正在从亚洲旅游大国、旅游强国向世界旅游强国发展。据统计,2005年我国接待国外旅游者人数居世界第4位,外汇收入居世界第7位。世界旅游组织秘书长弗朗吉亚利估计,到2020年,世界将有1.37亿人到中国去参观、访问和游览。届时,中国将成为世界第一大旅游目的地国和第四大旅游客源国。我国入境旅游市场的迅猛发展对我国旅游从业人员,尤其是对导游和其他涉外旅游人才的外语交际能力提出了更高的要求。为此,笔者根据外语导游基本素质和导游人员英语语言水平的要求,编写了《英语导游听说教程》一书。

本教程共15课,按全国最具代表的旅游省份和著名旅游城市编写,包括五个教学模块:1. 导游实务(包括导游服务规范和导游应变能力);2. 导游听力训练;3. 导游情景对话;4. 导游景点讲解;5. 导游景点翻译。本教程采取新型听说技术,强调教学互动,注重导游实践,特别注重导游人员听说能力的训练和培养。每一个教学模块都有生词表和课文注释,附有光盘,便于学生课后利用英语听说技术进行自主练习,巩固教学成果。


