### 前言

当前,大学英语四、六级考试正面临着前所未有的彻底改革。教育部继 2004 年在全国推行了《大学英语课程教学要求》之后,2005 年 6 月又将对四、六级考试题型和评分体系进行大幅调整。本书就是在这四、六级改革的强劲东风中,专门为面临考试的转型而感到茫然的学子们编写的一本词汇参考书。

我们知道,学习任何一种语言,关键是对词汇的掌握,没有词汇,听、说、读、写各项技能便不能发展,从而整体的语言水平也就无从提高,自然参加任何水平测试也就不可能取得理想的成绩。

本书以教育部颁布的《大学英语课程教学要求》(以下简称《大纲》)为蓝本,收尽了 《大纲》中一般要求的4 538个单词以及由这些单词构成的常用词组(含中学已学词汇),书 中加星号(\*)的单词为词纲中给出的积极词汇。为便于学生理解和记忆单词,本书在编写 过程中遵循了以下几个原则:第一,词纲中所有单词、词组及其所属义项均为中英文双语注 释,词表后的附录我们也给出了音标和中文注释,这样做的目的是使学生对单词的掌握更准 确。当然,有些单词的概念所指在中英文中完全一致,而英文解释又很繁琐,这样的单词我 们则只给了中文解释,目的是使读者有一目了然的感觉。第二,词纲中所有单词和词组及其 所属义项,除个别简单词汇或中学已学过的词汇外,我们都给出了例句、免去了读者在记单 词时不停查字典之苦。中学词汇之所以没有给出例句,是因为我们考虑到此部分词汇属于基 础词汇,读者们在中学阶段均已掌握娴熟,没有例句反而更加简单明了。当然,并非所有中 学词汇均无例句,考虑到某些单词或某些义项对读者来说较为生疏,我们也给出了例句。我 们对例句力求经典,对例句的结构争取有一定的难度,这样,通过一个小小的例句我们便给 读者提供了比较完整的语篇环境,使得单词记忆容易了许多。第三,除了《大纲》中给出的 词组外,本书还收入了四级考试中经常出现的或生活中常用的一些搭配词组,为读者参加四 级统考和提高英语综合运用能力提供了更全面的帮助。第四,为了便于读者对同类词汇的掌 握,我们在本书中还进行了相关的同义词辨析。第五,该书另外配有由外籍专家录制的磁 带,以方便大家的学习。总之,在使用本书时,您会有很多惊喜的发现。您会发现,您没有 想到的,我们已经替您想到了,您没有时间做的,我们已经帮您做了。对广大的英语教师朋 友们以及同等程度的语言工作者和自学者而言,本书都不失为一本很有帮助的参考书。

本书在编写过程中,因时间紧,工作繁杂,加之编者水平有限,错误与疏漏之处在所难免,欢迎广大读者批评指正。
