前 言

听力训练是大学英语教学的重要方面。组织学生在有指导的情况下提高听力能力是将来继续提高语言应用能力必不可少的条件。目前,英语听力教材相对较少,且比较单一。尤其是缺乏课外泛听教材和适用的有声资料。为了使听力教学更好地为贯彻教学大纲服务,使第二课堂更有效地提高学生的听力水平,我们编写了这套《大学英语泛听教程》。

本教程共分4册,供大学英语1~4级使用。每册分18个单元。每个单元为1小时,配相应的录音带。全部录音由外籍专家录制。

本教程内容有辨音、听写、填空、单句、短对话、短文、短故事、长对话和新闻。特别是新闻部分,直接录自美国之音,这在其他同类听力教材中是罕见的。

本教程编写时注意到知识性、趣味性和实用性,由浅入深,同时兼顾到目前全国大学英语四级考试中有可能出现的听力题型。

本教程的编写得到厦门大学外语教学部的支持。厦门大学出版社的编辑同志以及林立老师给我们提出了宝贵的意见。陈永毅老师在录音工作中给予很大的支持。谨此一并致谢。
