《硕士研究生英语学位课程考试词汇必备》严格遵循《非英语专业硕士研究生英语学位课程考试大纲》的要求，对硕士研究生英语学位课程考试及大学英语六级考试的必备英语词汇进行集中训练。目的是通过训练，帮助学生熟悉英语学位课程考试和大学英语六级考试词汇测试部分的内容，快速有效地扩大词汇量，掌握复用词汇的基本用法。

《硕士研究生英语学位课程考试词汇必备》测试题的各项指标严格控制在大纲要求的范围内，词或词组均为大纲所附词汇表、词根、词缀表所覆盖的内容。对派生词进行词根、词缀检查、比较，举一反三，扩大词汇量。词汇练习均在句子中进行，全书共 16 套词汇测试题，每套题由 100 题组成，分为两个内容：(1) 每题为一个英文句，句中有一个词或固定词组，采用下划线的形式，要求从所给的选择项中，选出该划线词或词组的最佳同义词或最佳释义；(2) 每题为一个英文句，句中有空白，要求从四个选项中，选出最恰当的词，并根据题意用适当的形式(如适当的时态、语态)或由该词组成的词组填空，使该句成为逻辑合理、表达正确的英文句。
