


# Chapter 1 A Home in the Sea





"Sorry," Laura said. "We thought you were right behind us."


"It's OK," Ana replied.

"But it looks **as if** one caught up with you," Laura noted.


Suddenly, the dolphin began to move its head up and down. It swam off a little ways. Then it stopped and looked back at the children.

"I think it wants us to come along," Ana said, putting her scubaboard in gear.




The children followed the dolphin. Soon they were met by a big group of dolphins. These dolphins swam around the scubaboards.

They reached the Starfish in a short time. To get inside, they had to go through three ports, or doors, in a row. Each one led to a different **entry** room.




# Starfish on Alert!
