- IV. (1) I'm afraid of Jack Green because my department is part of his department and Jack Green is my boss; Jack Green is afraid of me because most of the work in my department is done for the Sales Department, which is more important than his department, and I'm much closer to Andy Kagle and the other people in the Sales Department than he is.
