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【内容简介】《大学英语听读词库与测试——8 000 词》一书由四个部分及四个总复习测试习题组成。每部分由 10 个单元构成，每单元选词 20 个并配有相应的典型例句和测试练习，以帮助学习者，起到举一反三的效果。全书的词汇练习共分四大类：选择同义词及反义词、寻找与定义一致的单词、根据句意填写所缺单词和同类词及近义词的选配。该书还配有磁带，有助于英语学习者从音、形、意三个方面增强对所学词汇的记忆和深刻的理解。

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前　　言

词汇学习是英语学习过程中极为重要的一个组成部分。对于绝大部分学习英语的中国学生而言，词汇学习将伴随其整个学习过程。实践证明，他们中的许多人往往因为词汇学习遇到困难，而在不同的学习阶段放弃了为之努力多年的英语学习，成为他们遗憾终身的事。可见，词汇学习需要学习者具有极大的毅力并投入大量的时间。根据我们的调查研究，众多的学习者由于在词汇学习中遇到障碍，在中级或中高级阶段就放弃或中断了他们的学习。而不少进入高级阶段的学习者，则由于他们的英语水平基本上已达到实际应用程度，通常能持之以恒，坚持下去。本书就是针对中国学生这一特点而编写的。它将在一定程度上帮助众多的英语学习者渡过词汇学习各阶段的瓶颈难关。

1. 英语词汇学习的阶段性

在英语学习过程中，通常认为与初、中、高级阶段相适应的词汇量分别为 3 000, 5 000 和 8 000。对于一般的英语学习者而言，通过一段时间的学习都能较为顺利地完成初级阶段的学习，随后就进入了漫长且更为艰难的深入阶段。多年来，语言学界的研究和对我国英语学习者的调查结果表明，在我国这个特定环境中，英语学习者在初级阶段掌握词汇是一个学习阶段进程的标志。人们在多年教学实践中发现，总有一些较难的单词成为学习者的突出障碍。通过学习掌握这类词汇以后，学习者都有一种明显的上一级台阶的感觉。本套书就是根据这一原则和中国人学英语的特点，分别编写了有 3 000 单词的初级本，5 000 单词的中级本和 8 000 单词的高级本。

2. 本套书的词汇选择

实用性和针对性强是本套书选词的最大特点。本套书针对中国学生的学习特点和我国英语教学的特点,主要选择实用性强和在相应学习阶段较难的英语单词。在选择这些单词时,我们从实用原则出发,对这些难词进行了筛选。同时,选定了一些在英、美书刊中常用的,但少见于我国英语教科书的实用性单词,并尽量避免选择那些过于生僻且实用性有一定局限性的单词。

3. 高级本的编写

本书共选 800 个英语单词,主要选自朗文、兰登、柯林斯、剑桥及牛津等高级英语词典。我们的着眼点是进一步扩大通过初、中级阶段英语学习的中国学生常用词汇的广度和深度。针对进入高级阶段的中国学生深入学习英语的迫切需要,我们在本册中选用的词汇比他们已经掌握的常用词汇高一个层次。这些词常见于英、美文学作品和一些主要英文杂志,如:festive(欢乐的),adversity(苦难),disseminate(传播),negligent(疏忽的),halt(停止)等。这些词汇所表达的含义在英语学习的初级和中级阶段均有与其同义或近义的常见和常使用的单词。如:festive—merry,adversity—misfortune,disseminate—scatter,negligent—careless,halt—stop。了解和掌握这些词汇可帮助学生增强运用英语语言表达自己以及描述事物的广度及深度的能力。

为方便学习者的使用,每个单词均附有国际音标、词性说明和中文解释,同时还附一个例句及简单的英语解释或同义词、近义词。本书共分四个部分,每部分有 10 个单元。在每个单元的练习中,均对所学常用词和高级词汇进行演练,以加深学习者对这些词的印象和理解。

本书共有骨干词 800 个,连同练习中列出的同义词、反义词、近义词等共计 8 000 个单词,同时配有磁带,可供读者选用。

本套书的编写是由多位长期从事大学外语教学的教师合作完

成的。闫传海、郑永安担任全套书的总体策划，并设定全套书的框架和界定选词范围。本套书初级本由曹勇编著，中级本由张梅娟、闫传海编著，高级本由王健、张奕编著。本套书的编写还得到其他教师的帮助和指导，可以说，本套书的出版是多位同仁共同努力的结晶，作者在此表示诚挚的谢意。
