前言

新托福的测试目的是考查考生对北美校园生活和学习的适应能力,是一种全方位的测试,涵盖英语听、说、读、写四个方面,考的是英语真功夫。从词汇方面来看,既要求考生有一定的词汇量,又要求熟练掌握必备词汇,以满足语言交际的需要。考前背词仍然不失为一种有效的备考方式。为了帮助考生准备新托福,我们编写了《新托福词汇速记》一书。

全书总体上分为三个部分,第一部分是考试常用词汇及其派生词8000余个,对其中的重要单词配备了有针对性的例句,通过例句,考生不仅记住了单词,而且掌握了用法。所有例句都不配给中文翻译,目的是给考生提供一个完全英语环境下熟悉和应用单词的机会。该部分词汇既可以完全满足托福考试的口语和写作部分需要,同时也可以基本满足听力和阅读部分的需要。第二部分是托福固定搭配词组和惯用短语,共约1000个,可以作为第一部分必备词汇的必要补充。第三、四部分是常用的词根和词缀,通过词根和词缀,给考生提供一个记忆、扩充词汇的方法,同时培养考生根据词根和词缀精测陌生词汇的能力。

所有词汇全部来自托福考试真题,且考试复现率达90%以上,因而具有很强的科学性和针对性,有利于考生对托福词汇进行系统复习和提高应试能力。同时针对新托福的特点,添加了美国校园经常使用的生活和学习词汇。

本书由纪飞、王勋主编,参加编写的人员还有刘乃亚、沙玉新、周河、安枚、刘建平、方茂、汤华、成枫、周雄方、李汤灵、张经峰等。

由于编者水平有限,书中的不妥之处在所难免,衷心希望广大读者批评指正。
