修订版前言

本书自1991年出版以来,已重印10多次,总印数近10万册。为了更好地满足学生的需要,现根据1999年新调整的《大学英语教学大纲通用词汇表》作了全面修订:加强了基础部分;删去了部分词汇重复或重点不突出的题句;对原来的某些选择项也作了调整;新增补了一些词汇热点题、难点题和常考题(新增题约占1/3)。修订版共收测试题3189题;其中1~4级词汇1563题,1~4级词组676题,5~6级词汇950题。除了供学生自学自测外,也可作为课内外的补充练习。

前言

大学英语教学大纲规定,大学生一般应掌握的英语词汇量为 4000~5300个左右。在"大纲词汇表"中相当多的单词往往是 "一词多类"或"一词多义"。仅按"词汇表"所列的简略词义统计,实际要求掌握的词汇义项就达13000个左右。例如,词汇表中 fine 一词的义项为5项, present 一词的义项为7项, set 为18项, 而 get 和 go 的义项(连同它们所构成的短语动词)均多达28项。由此可见词汇学习的艰巨性。

本书专为帮助学生掌握大学英语词汇而设计,共收编词汇测试题 3 000 题。第一部分(1 563 题)内容涉及 1~4 级基础词汇;第二部分(676 题)内容涉及 1~4 级常用词组;第三部分(950 题)是 5,6 级词汇。以上 3 000 道测试题侧重反映词形、词义、读音、用法和搭配等方面容易混淆的词语。本书中所用的词汇,几乎覆盖了大纲词汇表中的全部词汇。因此,本书可供学生全面系统复习大纲词汇表中的全部词汇使用。为便于自学自测,书后附有全部答案。

通过句子来掌握词汇,既有助于记住单词本身,又可同时熟悉词的用法和搭配。实践证明,这比孤立地背记单词或背词典效果要好得多。编写本书时,我们广泛地利用了各种英美原著和测试题,题句尽可能保留原著的自然语景,并尽量避免超出大纲的词汇;另外,增补了"词汇表"漏收的少量常用词和义项。限于编者水平,书中难免有不妥之处,热忱欢迎使用本书的师生批评指正。
