## 前言

《大学英语——走向职场》(上下册)是一套全新的,为高等院校各专业公共英语教学编写的综合英语教程。本套教材着力兼顾语言知识和职场英语的应用,进一步更新观念、更新内容、更新体系、更新要求。

### 一、编写理念

### (一) 英语语言知识与职场英语同步进行

本套教材以英语语言为核心,以职场为背景,以实践为主线,教学内容职场化,增加了学生未来所从事职业必备的英语知识。教材分为两大模块,即:英语语言知识模块和职场英语应用模块。英语语言知识模块主要培养学生必须掌握的、实用的英语语言知识和技能,提高学生说、听、读、写、译诸方面的基本技能,实现教育部《高职高专英语教学基本要求》规定的教学目标;职场英语应用模块是结合学生在未来职场中从事涉外事务工作需要,培养学生具有阅读和翻译英文资料的初步能力,使学生具备继续学习工作岗位群英语的潜能。

### (二)说、听领先,读、写同步

本套教材变传统教材的"听说领先,读写跟上"为现在的"说听领先,读写同步"的新理念。根据国人学习外语的经验,只有在获得了一定的外语口语的常用短语及套语的基础之上,才能更有效地提高学生的外语听力水平。本教材加大了"说"的能力训练,把培养实用口语交际能力作为教材的重要任务,这对于我国外语教学中长期存在的"哑巴"英语现象是一个重大突破。每个单元的口语训练部分都有完整的情景对话样例。学生可以进行模拟对话,这样既提高了学生的语言交际能力,也培养了他们的人际交往和团队合作能力,而这两种能力正是当今国际化人才所必备的。

### (三) 主题辐射

本套教材使说、听、读、写、译各项技能的培养与训练围绕同一话题展开。这种编写模式一方面能够让学生在一个多维空间里不断学习和巩固所学知识,另一方面也使得学生的各项英语技能得到平衡发展。

### 二、编写特点

### (一) 构思新颖、适用面广

本套教材特别突出了涉外事务的需要,教材编写既符合涉外交际的需要,又结合了教学特点。

### (二) 实用性和趣味性并重

本套教材具备现代教材的特征, 书中所提倡的教学策略与国际上英语课程教材的 主流思想基本吻合, 同时兼顾了以汉语为母语的课堂实际教学情况和特点。教材的取 材和话题充分体现实用性、交际性和多样性, 教材语言内容不仅地道纯正, 而且更贴



近时代、贴近学生的生活,可读性强,使学生在学习过程中不断产生新的需要和动机。

### (三)通用性高

本套教材在教学模式、课堂教学和课后练习上提供了广阔空间,可以让不同地区、不同群体、不同层次乃至不同时期的学习者各取所需地选用学习资源。教材强调"以学生为中心",重视开发学习者的自我潜能。
