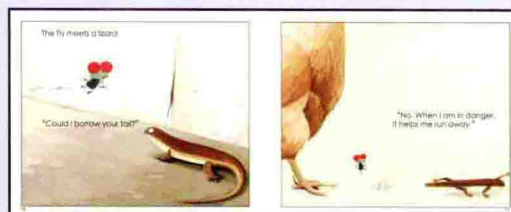
The fly meets a monkey.

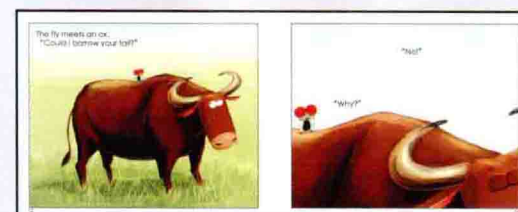
The fly meets a kangaroo.

“不行！”“为什么？”



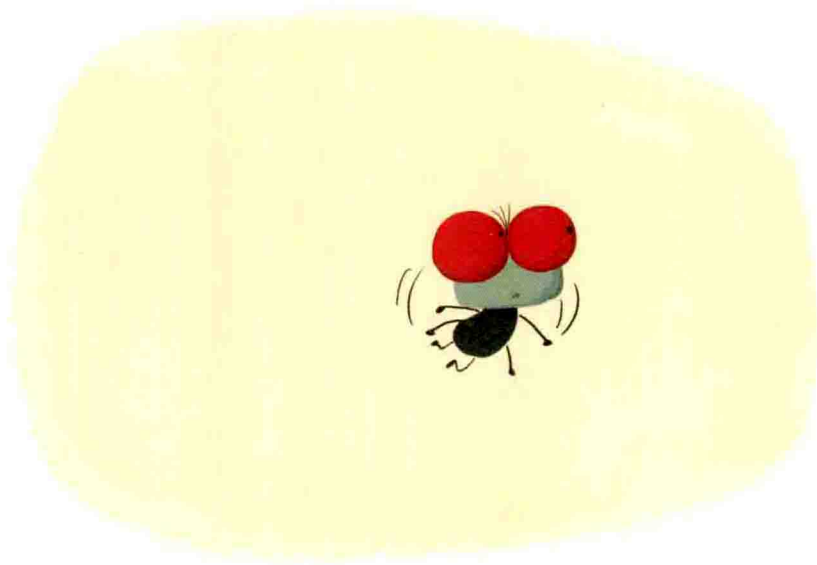
The ox says nothing.

老牛什么也没说。他甩甩尾巴，把苍蝇赶跑了。



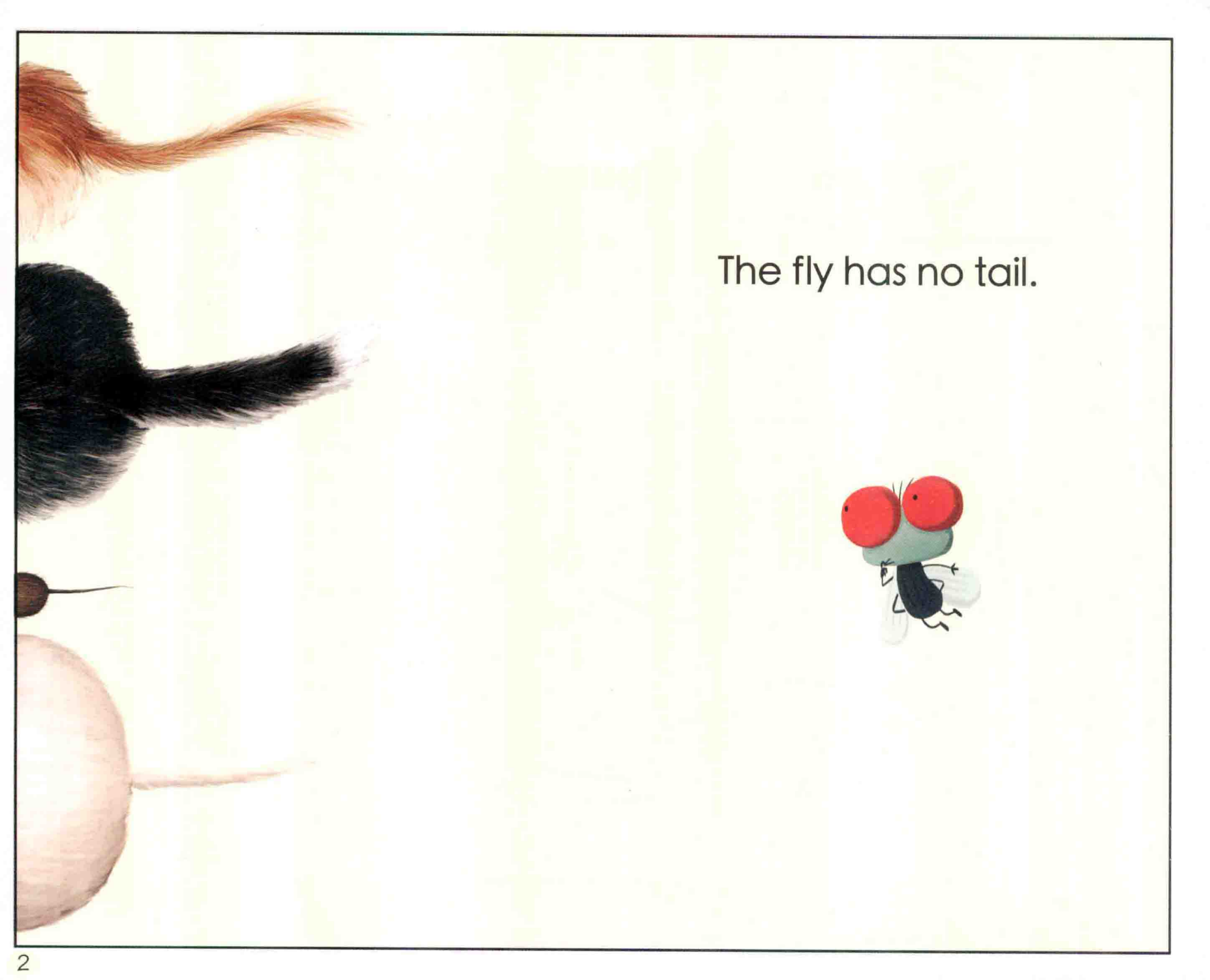

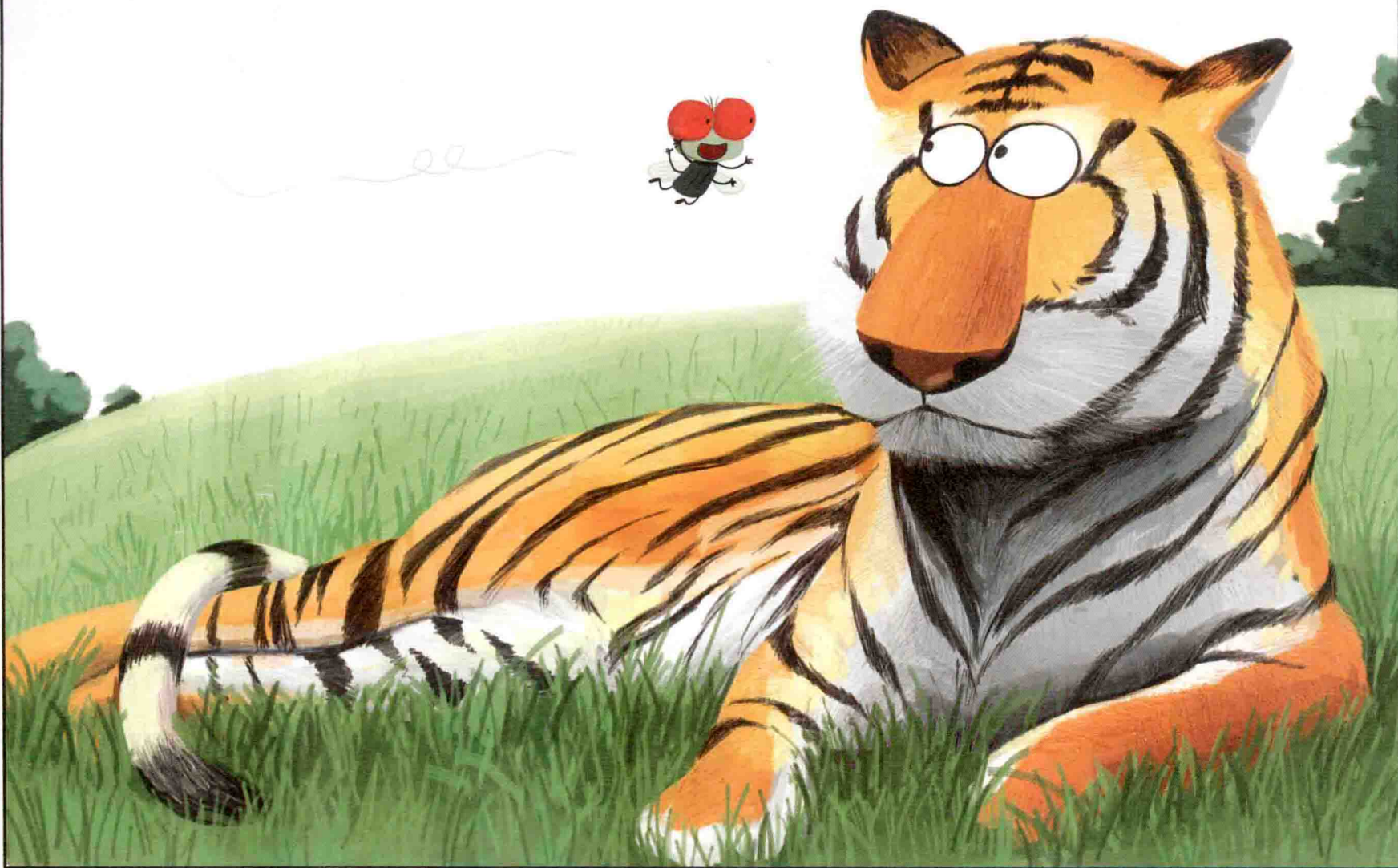

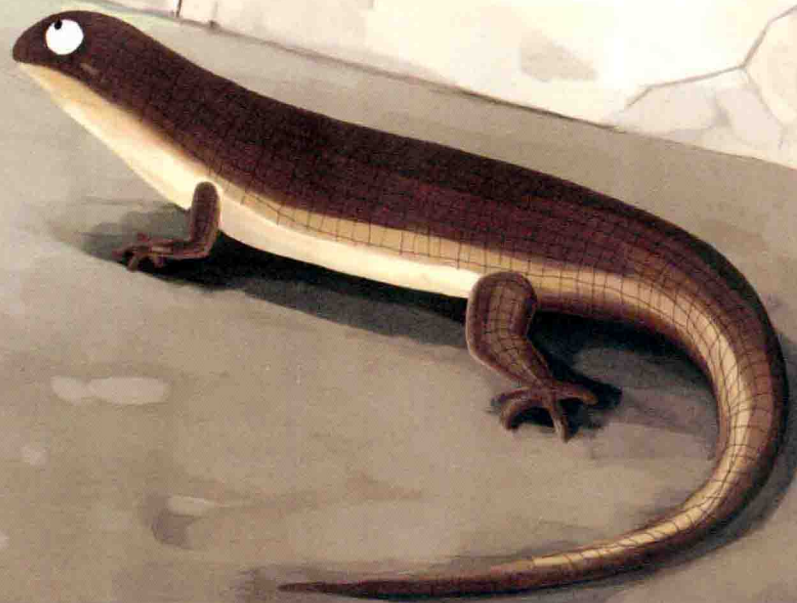

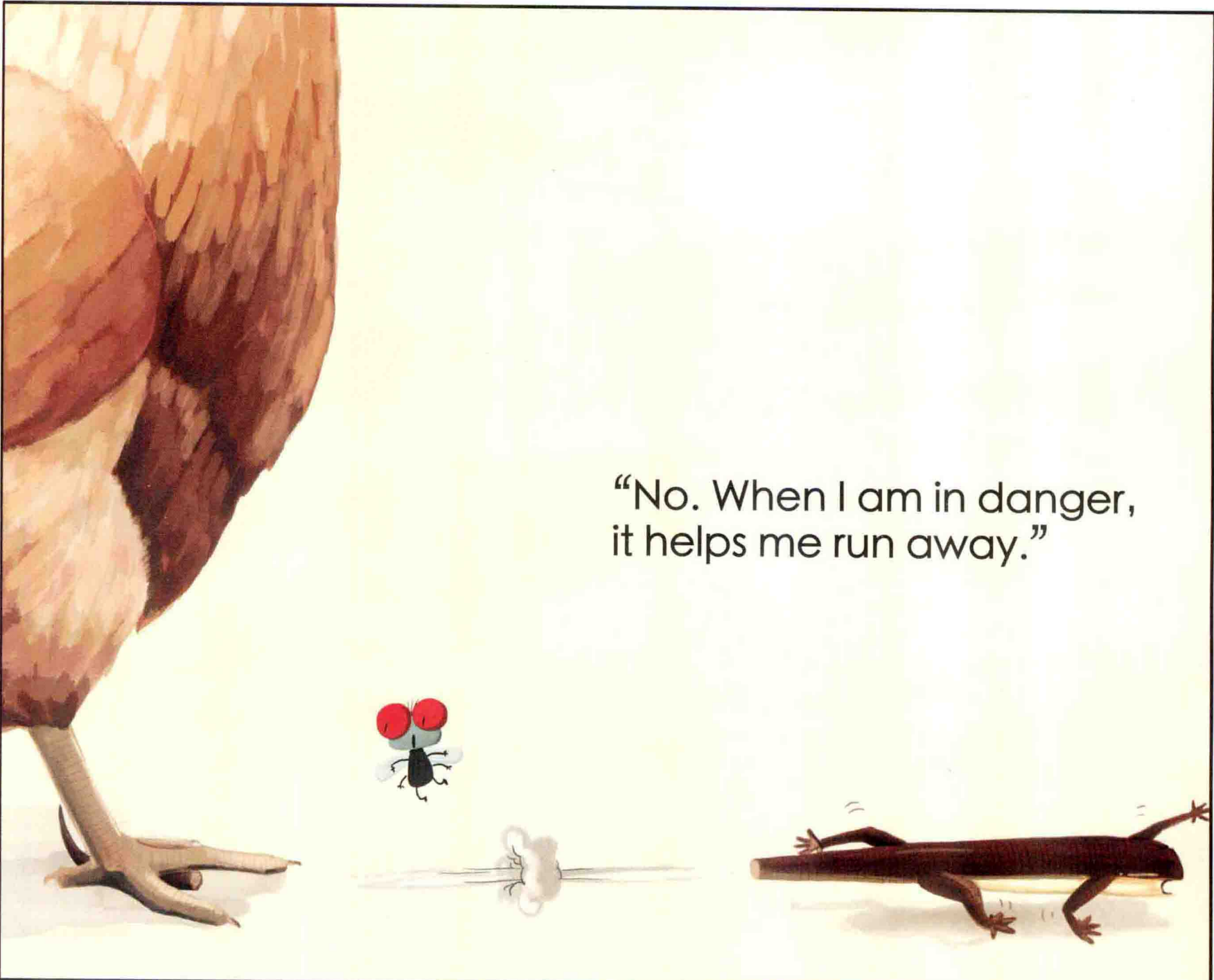
