前

言

目前,大学英语教师最关注的问题是如何培养学生实际运用语言的能力。人们普遍认为听力是提高语言运用能力的关键,只有听懂他人的话,才能与其进行交际。听是基础,它直接影响交际能力的培养,尤其是刚入学的大学生,听力的提高会使他们增强信心,对英语产生极大兴趣。听力提高后,他们不必单靠视觉,还可通过听觉来获取语言信息,这样学生就有更多的机会模仿英语的语音、语调,提高英语表达能力。

然而,由于学生在入学前大多未接受过系统的听力训练,听力往往是学生的弱项。有的学生入学后听不懂英语录音,甚至听不懂老师用英语授课。他们急于闯过听力关,但目前听力训练,尤其是由浅入深、阶梯式听力材料却很少见。学生所接触的材料往往偏难,常常抱怨没有合适的材料可听。针对这种实际情况,我们根据新的大学英语教学大纲的精神,编写了这套英语听力教材 1~6 册。我们衷心希望这套教材能为学生提供合适的听力材料,帮助他们进行大量的课外训练,通过接触大量的语音材料使他们的听力达到"质"的变化。

本套教材力求内容由浅入深,难易程度与学生掌握的词汇量相一致,使学生步步深入,稳步提高。它的信息量大,每课由五段听力材料组成,并配以简捷快速的检查手段,使学生绝大部分时间处于接收语言信息的状态。

本套教材训练方法多样,运用交际法教学理论,着重进行听力基本技能训练,培养学生听—判断,听—记录,听—归纳,听—阅读,听—推测等项技能。虽然每段听力材料要求听两遍,每遍之后配有一种练习,但学生可根据实际情况灵活处理。如果听力较差,找不出练习答案,可多听几遍,直至听懂后再做练习。

本套教材图文并茂,每课至少配有一幅插图,用以帮助学生理解听力材料的内容。而且适应面广,不仅可作为课外训练材料,也可用做课堂听力教材;不仅适用于大学学生,也适用于社会各阶层人士自学英语之用。本套教材
