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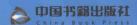
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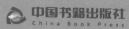
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外朗教育指定新托福(TOEFL iBT)培训教材

#### **Brood Parasitism**

Brood parasitism is a strategy used by brood parasites where organisms manipulate and use host individuals either of the same or different species to raise the young of the brood parasite. This relieves the parasitic parents from the investment of rearing young or building nests, enabling them to spend more time foraging, producing offspring, etc. Brood parasitism has been observed among birds, insects, and fish. This parasitic relationship is typically to the detriment of the host species as eggs and brood compete for incubation, nourishment, and protection.

#### Question 1

Talk about your favorite subject from elementary school. Explain why you liked it in details.

#### Response 1

My favorite elementary school subject was reading. My teacher would always introduce me to exciting and informative reading material that really appealed to my sense of wonder and curiosity. For example, one week I would read about dinosaurs and animals of the past and the next week I would read about important historical events or read exciting fictional stories. My teacher would always choose interesting books and subjects and in this way helped nurture in me a love for books that still exists today. I would really like to thank my reading teacher for helping me discover a great hobby.

#### Question 2

Some people prefer to watch entertainment TV programs; others prefer to watch educational programs. Which do you prefer? Explain why.

#### Response 2

I really enjoy watching both entertainment and educational programs on TV. However, if I had to choose, I think I would prefer watching educational television programs. First, I think educational programs are much more stimulating and exciting than entertainment shows. I can usually learn something new or see something new if I watch an educational program. I like to watch programs about science and physics as well as documentaries and historical biographies. Second, the entertainment programming is usually of very poor quality, which I do not find very funny or enjoyable. I think entertainment shows are shows that people only watch when they are bored and don't want to think very hard. (112 words)

- A: Hi Samantha. Did you read the opinion letter in the school newspaper today?
- B: The one about the university art fair?
- A: Yes, that one. What do you think?
- B: I would have to disagree with that letter. I don't really think it is a good idea.
- A: Why is that?
- B: Well, first, the university already has an art fair on campus that is hosted in the student center. Students already have ample opportunities to display their pieces and get feedback from professors and the public. I don't really see the need for a second art fair.
- A: Oh, I didn't know that.
- B: Second, I don't think that many of the students would want to donate any proceeds from an art show.
- A: Really? You don't think that they would want to donate to charity?
- B: I think most of the art students will want to keep the money. You know, art supplies are rather expensive. Canvas, paint, brushes, and other supplies are not cheap. I think that most students would rather keep the money.
- A: I didn't think of that.
- B: I don't think there will be too much student support for another university art fair.

#### Response 3

The two students are discussing an opinion letter that another student wrote regarding a campus art fair where students can display their artwork and donate the proceeds to charity. The woman in the listening disagrees with the letter for two reasons. First, she says that there is already an art fair on campus in the student center. Students already have ample opportunities to receive critical feedback from their professors and the public. Secondly, the woman says that most art students would probably be opposed to donating proceeds from selling their artwork. She says that art supplies like canvas, paints and brushes are in fact very expensive and students will want to recoup some of these costs.

#### Lecture

Brood parasitism is a very interesting and peculiar evolutionary phenomenon whereby a parasite organism leaves its offspring to be incubated and cared for by a host organism. The parasite organism typically accomplishes this by manipulating or tricking the host into believing that parasite brood is in fact host brood. The host organism will then care for this parasite brood, which is usually at the detriment of the host brood as both broods compete for nourishment and survival. Brood parasitism behavior has been widely observed among birds, fish, and insects. Let me give you an example so you can better understand this phenomenon. Fish A is the host organism while Fish B is the parasitic organism. Fish A lays eggs in the water and after fertilization the eggs are stored safely in the mouth of Fish A during the incubation period. Storing the eggs inside of the mouth provides a safe environment for the eggs to incubate as the chance of predation is greatly diminished. Fish B, the parasitic organism, also lays and fertilizes their eggs and hides them amongst the eggs of Fish A. Fish A unknowingly takes both broods into its mouth and incubates them. This has relieved Fish B parents from any responsibility of incubating, protecting or nourishing their young because Fish A has been successfully tricked into caring for both broods. Fish B have more time to spend looking for food and producing more offspring while Fish A is stuck with the burden of looking after the offspring.

#### Response 4

Brood parasitism is a phenomenon where by a parasitic organism will deceive and trick a host organism into incubating and nurturing the offspring of another organism. The professor gives an example of two fish to illustrate this phenomenon. Fish A lays and fertilizes eggs before carrying them in its mouth for incubation. Fish B, the parasitic organism, will lay and fertilize eggs in the same area as Fish A. When Fish A goes to protect and incubate its eggs, it will also protect and incubate the eggs of Fish B. This is how Fish B tricks the host fish into taking care of its brood. (104 words)

#### Conversation

- A: Hi, Steven. How have you been?
- B: Oh, I've been okay. Just having a bit of trouble completing a school project.
- A: What seems to be the problem? Maybe I can help.
- B: Well, the problem is that it is so noisy in the dormitory and I have three roommates. They are nice guys but sometimes they are very loud and it is hard for me to concentrate on my studies.
- A: I see. Well, what about going to the library to do your studying?
- B: I thought about that. The library would be a quiet place to study, but I have quite a lot of material for my project and it would be inconvenient to carry it back and forth from my dorm room to the library. It would be a lot more convenient to just stay in my room.
- A: Well, why don't you talk to your roommates? Maybe they can be a little more conscientious.
- B: I thought about that too. I was thinking of coming up with a study schedule for our dorm room so that during certain hours of the day it would be quiet and we could study. The problem with this is that I'm afraid if I tell them they are being noisy it might cause some trouble. I don't want them to take it the wrong way.
- A: That's true. They might not understand.
- B: I don't know what to do. I need to finish my project soon.

#### Response 5

The two students in the listening are discussing a problem the man has. He needs to finish a project but his roommates are very noisy and distracting. He has two solutions. First, he can go to the library to work on his project. Second, he can ask his roommates to be a little quieter and organize a study schedule. I would recommend the man ask his roommates to be quieter and respect a study schedule. I do not think it would cause any problems in his dorm room because they are all students and will respect the need to have a quiet environment in which to study. Also, taking his project items and material back and forth from his dorm to the library will be very inconvenient.

#### [Lecture]

Two types of advertising methods exist to help better serve the consumer market and the industrial market. Consumer marketing is defined as creating and selling products, goods and services to individual buyers. The consumer market represents individuals and families purchasing goods and services for personal consumption. The consumer market excludes business or government purchases, or other non-personal investments. Industrial marketing, also commonly called business marketing, on the other hand, deals with marketing goods and services from one business to another business. Let's take a look at an example of each type of advertising method so that you can better understand these two concepts. An example of consumer marketing would be a medical company that makes cold medicine. This company markets directly to the public and attempts to persuade the consumer of the benefits and necessity of this type of cold medicine. The consumer, in turn, buys the medicine directly from the company for personal consumption. An example of industrial marketing would be an office furniture company that targets sales to other companies. In this example, the office furniture company does not need to speak directly with individual consumers or employees, but rather advertise to and negotiate with other large companies. The furniture company looks to convince companies of the need to purchase new office furniture and upgrade existing furniture. Industrial marketing is only concerned with business-to-business advertising because products are used to facilitate company operations.

#### Response 6

Consumer marketing and industrial marketing are two different advertising strategies used by companies to promote their products and services. Consumer marketing is an advertising strategy where a company advertises to individual buyers directly. An example of this is a company that advertises cold medicine directly to the consumer as a cold remedy. Industrial marketing, on the other hand, is an advertising strategy where a company will advertise their goods and services to another company. An example of industrial marketing is a furniture company that looks to persuade other companies to buy their office furniture. These are two advertising strategies used to market to two different market segments.
