方法指导

 1. 做好知识储备。由于个人信息保护为新出现的问题和话题,教材上尚没有过多涉及,同学们可通 过网络、书刊报纸、教师、父母等途径获取此类知识作为积累和铺垫。这样,遇到类似文章,只要看懂大 致,甚至看懂一二,即可激活你已有的知识储备,无论是阅读还是理解答题,自然就会变得容易起来。

2. 积累与此话题有关的英语词汇、句型等, 如identity card (身份证), fingerprint (指纹)。

 阅读过程中,提高自己对生词的猜测能力,主要根据上下文来分析词意,做题时以文章观点为主, 不可依据经验主观臆断。

Passage 1

Elizabeth Edwards was many things to many people: a beloved mother, a brave cancer survivor, a tireless advocate, a best-selling author, and a symbol of strength and resilience(顺应力).

Her death at age 61 on Tuesday, just one day after announcing she would no longer be seeking medical treatment after six years of battling cancer, inspired immediate support from every corner of America.

President Obama and the First Lady expressed their sadness on Tuesday while praising Edwards for her work

on health care and fighting poverty.

"In her life, Elizabeth Edwards knew tragedy and pain," they said in a statement. "Many others would have turned inward; many others in the face of such adversity would have given up. But through all that she <u>endured</u>, Elizabeth showed a kind of fortitude(刚毅) and grace that will long remain a source of inspiration."

Secretary of State Hillary Clinton said she was "deeply saddened" by Edwards' death. "She made her mark on America, and she will not be forgotten," Clinton said.

"Elizabeth Edwards fought a brave battle against a terrible disease that takes too many lives every day," said Vice President Joe Biden. Senator John Kerry, who shared the ticket with John Edwards in 2004, said his family was "grateful for the time we shared getting to know her," while outgoing Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi called Elizabeth a "pillar of strength(中流砥柱)."

Many celebrities also took to Twitter on Tuesday to express their grief. "My heart goes out to Elizabeth Edwards' young children," wrote media giant Arianna Huffington. "She showed so much grace in the face of so much suffering."

Filmmaker Michael Moore praised Edwards for her work on health care, tweeting, "Thank u Elizabeth Edwards —& on the day we achieve universal healthcare 4 all Americans, u will b there, & we will thank u again."

Marie Curie was born on November 7, 1867 in Poland and died on July 4, 1934. As a child, Marie Curie amazed people with her great memory. She learned to read when she was only four years old. Her father was a professor of science and the instruments that he kept in a glass case interested Marie. She dreamed of becoming a scientist, but that would not be easy. Her family was very poor, and at the age of 18, Marie became a governess. In 1891, Marie attended the Sorbonne University in Paris where she met and married Pierre Curie, a well-known physicist.

The radioactive elements radium and polonium, discovered by Marie Curie and her husband Pierre Curie, represent one of the best known stories in modern science for which they won the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1901. Marie Curie was honored with asecond Nobel Prize in 1911, this time in chemistry, to honor her for successfully isolating pure radium and determining radium's atomic weight.

Marie Curie studied X-rays and found that the harmful properties of X-rays were able to kill tumors. By the end of World War I, Marie Curie was probably the most famous woman in the world. She had made a <u>conscious</u> decision, however, not to patent methods of processing radium or its medical applications, hoping it would benefit as many people as it were to.

Marie Curie contributed greatly to our understanding of radioactivity and the effects of X-rays. She died of leukemia, caused by her repeated exposure to radioactive material.

Pele was born to a very poor family on October 23, 1940. His real name is Edson Arantes do Nascimento. Pele is just a nickname.

Pele first learned the game of soccer from his father. As a youngster, Pele played soccer for a local club. By the time he was 16, he was playing professionally for the Santos Football Club. The club won nine national championships while he played for it.

Pele also played for Brazil's national team in four World Cups. At his first World Cup in 1958, when he was just 17, Pele scored an amazing six goals. In the final game against Sweden, he scored two goals and Brazil won its firstever World Cup. Pele also helped Brazil win World Cups in 1962 and 1970.

Pele had an outstanding natural ability as a soccer player. He had great speed and balance and was able to shoot powerfully and accurately with either foot and with his head. Pele said he did not do this for the money. He said that he wanted to make soccer a truly popular sport in the United States. Millions of North Americans gained a new respect for the game after watching Pele play.

Passage 5

When the nine-year-old Barack Obama was looking through a magazine, the African-American boy was shocked by a series of photos. The pictures were of a black man who destroyed his skin with chemicals in order to make himself white. For the first time, the boy began to doubt who he was.

However, now the boy who used to doubt his identity doesn't see it as a problem any more, but an advantage for his successful career. Last week Obama made history by being elected as the first black president of the United States. He defeated John McCain in a landslide victory.

Obama's story starts in opposite corners of the world. His white mother was born in the heartland of the US. His black father grew up in a tiny village in Kenya. They met during college in Hawaii, but his father left the family when Obama was just two years old and his mother moved to Indonesia. At 10, Obama moved back to live with his white grandparents in Hawaii. At his class, a white boy asked Obama if his father ate people. Out of embarrassment, Obama lied to his classmates that his father was a prince. "I kept asking who I am and I ended up trying drugs and drinking," Obama recalled.

Things came to change after the young man made friends with those with a similar background at college. Their

experiences back in Africa helped Obama to finally face up to his African origin. He worked hard to become a star at Harvard Law School and the third black senator in US history.

At the beginning of his campaign for the White House, few people expected Obama to win it. Many doubted his unusual background, which left him neither "black" enough nor "white" enough. But Obama turned his pain of growing up into a tool to make Americans believe: "There is not a black America and a white America, a Latino America, an Asian America. There's the United States of America."
