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《初级英语视听说教程》是解放军理工大学联合军队多所院校开发的《研究生英语课程 系列教材》之一。本套系列教材主要供非英语专业研究生使用,包括《初级英语综合教程》、 《初级英语视听说教程》、《中级英语综合教程》、《中级英语视听说教程》、《高级英语综合教 程》和《国际学术交流英语教程》。

《初级英语视听说教程》主要供具有一般英语水平的非英语专业硕士研究生使用,同样 也适合其他具备相应水平的英语学习爱好者。

本教程以国内外原版音频和视频材料为内容,以训练英语交流能力为重点,以视听结 合、听说结合及形式多样的练习为主要环节而编写。

按照不同的话题,本教程共设12个单元主题,涉及教育、科技、经济、军事、法律、职业、 媒体、伦理、语言、文化等,并根据相应阶段水平的英语学习者在听力中常常遇到的问题设置 了12个不同方面的听力技巧讲解,配以相关练习。每单元音视频材料的音质良好、画面清 晰,练习形式多样、内容丰富、难度适中,以国外原版材料为主,确保语言输入的丰富性、多样 性以及真实性。

本课程以听力理解和口语表达技能训练为重点,通过视听说综合训练,协调发展英语的 听说能力,提高综合应用英语在本专业领域和相关领域获取、表达和交流信息的能力;以丰 富的英语视听说实践活动为途径,增强对英语国家社会、文化、经济、军事和科技发展的了解 与认知,拓展知识、启迪思维、开阔视野,为提高综合素质和全面发展奠定良好的基础。

为方便教师备课和学生自主学习,教材编写组开发了与教学内容相配套的网络课程,构 建了立体化的教学内容体系。

本教程在编写过程中参阅了国内外的大量有关文献,谨在此致以由衷的感谢。

本教程虽几易其稿,力求完善,但由于我们的水平有限,不当之处在所难免,诚望各位同 行和读者提出批评和建议。
